President-Elect Says He's Pre-eminently a Statesman, With Faculty For Future Planning.

Hot Springs, Va., Nov. 18.-There was a conference at the Taft cottage here this afternoon on New York politics, general political affairs and especially regarding persons and measures perregarding persons and measures per-taining to the next administration. The conferees were President-elect Taft, Vice President-elect Sherman and Wil-liam Ward, national Republican com-mitteeman from New York Mr. Taft arrived from Cincinnati this morning and the vice president-elect and Mr. Ward from the east tonight Mr. Sherman will stop in Washington tomorrow and in Philadelphia before reaching his New York home.

While no one to the conference wishes to be quoted on the subject, it may be stated as the opinion of all that Secy. Root will be the successor in the United States senate of T. C. Platt. This, of course, is based upon the un-derstanding that Mr. Root wishes the place. Judge Taft has had no hesitancy from the first in giving positive ex-pression to his desire to make Mr. Root the premier of his cabinet. He has also stated that if his persuasion could

also stated that if his persuasion could prevail the present secretary of state would retain that portfolio despite his senatorial ambitions.

"Mr. Root is pre-eminently a states man," said the judge today in referring to his cordial feeling and admiration for the secretary of state.

"He has the most wonderful faculty for the planning for the future, both with respect to the domestic affairs and international relations, of any one I have known. He has such a plan for the development of our relations with the South and Central American countries. Such plans must, as indeed must tries. #### WILL RECEIVE BIDS FOR PANAMA BONDS

Washington, Nov. 18—Seey. Cortelyou late today made public an announcement that he would receive bids up to the close of business Dec. 5 next, for \$30,000,000 Panama canal bonds or any part thereof to bear two per cent interest. The bonds will be dated November 1, 1809, thus making them a new issue, and interest will begin as of that date. The bonds, by the terms of the law authorizing their issue, will be redeemable in gold in 10 years from their date and payable in 30 years. As an evidence of good faith the secretary requires each bid to be accompanied by a certified check payable to the secretary of the treasury for two per cent of the amount of the bid.

The bonds will be issued in denominations of \$20 to \$100 and \$1,000 and \$10,000 of registered bonds. They will be exempt from all taxes or duties of the United States as well as taxation in any form, by state, municipality or locality. They will be avail-Washington, Nov. 18-Secy. Cortel-

They will be available to national banks as security for circulating medium and receivable as security for public deposits. In national banks. The law forbids their sale at less than par and provides that all citizens of the United States shall have equal opportunity to suscribe therefore.
