

WEATHER AND CROPS

The Past Week a Very Cool One for This Season of the Year.

STRAWBERRIES RIPE AT NOAR

1000 Sugar Beets Growing Fast in Utah County.—First, Salt and Rain.

Observer Salinity makes the following report on Utah weather and crops for the past week:

The past week, on the whole, could not be considered a good one for growth—it was much colder than the average for this season of the year. Several severe frosts occurred, doing damage to many vegetables in fruit and tender vegetables.

Water—Froze very near every night, except if it was killed the first time which was just in bloom. All grain looking well.

MILLARD COUNTY.

Logan—Frost very morning except the 13th. After that frost is all gone. Corn is healthy; beans are frost-killed.

Oak City—Beans and other tender plants slightly injured by frost. Crops growing slowly.

Kamas—A changeable week, sometimes frosty, sometimes warm. No irrigation for wheat and small grain in past seven days. Corn has irrigated since before this time of the year.

SALT LAKE COUNTY.

Pinkney—Frosts three days pleasant; latter part of week turned to good growth of grass and grain.

GRAND COUNTY.

Green River—Conditions last week very favorable to crops, which are now doing well.

HOOD RIVER COUNTY.

Richardson—The entire week cool and windy most of the time; peas in bloom; new potatoes forming; growing well; carrots, onions, turnips, radishes, etc., very well advanced.

Most ripe strawberries are plentiful. On the 23rd frost killed some garden vegetables and grape vines in a few isolated localities.

PUTNEY COUNTY.

Logan—Wheat very cold; only a small amount of burning; the continued night frosts have damaged all crops more or less.

Tessicote—High drying winds have prevailed during the past several days, the snow cover of young wheat and barley. Considering the adverse weather, crops are doing well.

Heber—The crops do not seem to grow much, an amount of cold weather; ground very dry until a heavy fall of rain on the 23rd.

Mirville—Conditions have been favorable, but we don't think this frost was severe enough to injure the fruit.

MUCH COUNTY.

Harrisville—Rain of the 23rd had a very beneficial tendency to brighten up the weather.

Morgan—Very heavy rain on 23rd and caused all beauty, with little or no frost to hurt anything. Crops look fine.

Harrisville—A cold week, everything growing slowly, river low. Apple blossoms not yet out.

MORMON COUNTY.

Petersen—The past week has been a fair one. Spring looks very promising and healthy.

DAVIS COUNTY.

Layton—All kinds of crops are looking well. Frost 23rd and 24th.

SALT LAKE COUNTY.

Taylorville—The past week has been cold. On Tuesday, 23rd, there was a fine rain which did much good. The close of the week was favorable.

Mill Creek—Crops doing well, particularly corn, beans, strawberries doing well, partial frost.

Sandy—First three days of the week were cold, but the latter part much warmer. Lenses and grain do not grow much, and some grain is looking yellow.

RICHFIELD COUNTY.

Charleston—Winter has lingered, and the week has been unfavorable to the growth of crops. The wind drives sand over the fields. Irrigation has begun. Frosts do not appear to have injured fruits as yet.

Heber—Cold and chilly week; heavy frost will kill 4 inches thick on the 23rd. It injured garden trucks and killed strawberries. Apples are in full bloom. The wind blew a hurricane on the 23rd.

WEAVER COUNTY.

Lake—The week on the whole has been encouraging. Tender crops suffered from winds and frost, making the season still later than it was already. But all small grain looks well enough to be harvested.

Dixie—On the 23rd there was

rain and on the hillsides snow. Highways injured tender vegetation, larger trees are growing faster; both old and young are engaged in weeding them.

JUAN COUNTY.

Little Salt Creek—First part of week very unfavorable; snowfall on 23rd; frost and some damage to fruit and vegetables.

Logan—Snow, frost and snow on 23rd; this evening of 24th, also 25th. No significant damage to fruit or vegetables, grain is backward.

SAVAGE COUNTY.

Mormon (1)—Windy every day, causing ground to dry fast. Frosty potatoes are continuing to come up.

(2)—Plant frost 23rd and 24th doing some damage to fruit and vegetables. Crops losing well, some being triggered.

Spring City—Another cool week, hindering the growth of crops and causing them to turn yellow and look sickly.

Wells—Froze very near every night, except if it was killed the first time which was just in bloom. All grain looking well.

MILLARD COUNTY.

Logan—Frost every morning except the 13th. After that frost is all gone. Corn is healthy; beans are frost-killed.

Oak City—Beans and other tender plants slightly injured by frost. Crops growing slowly.

Kamas—A changeable week, sometimes frosty, sometimes warm. No irrigation for wheat and small grain in past seven days. Corn has irrigated since before this time of the year.

SALT LAKE COUNTY.

Pinkney—Two or three days pleasant; latter part of week turned to good growth of grass and grain.

GRAND COUNTY.

Green River—Conditions last week very favorable to crops, which are now doing well.
