

WOMAN'S LEAGUE WILL WORK FOR PLAYGROUND

Meeting Held Yesterday Is Addressed By Dr. T. B. Beatty on Humane Society's Aim.

The Women's league held a profitable and well attended meeting yesterday afternoon in the library hall, where Dr. Beatty was present and spoke on the work of the Utah Humane Society. He called attention to the fact that the humane organizations, can accomplish a great deal of good along the line of teaching children to be considerate to dumb animals. Mrs. H. M. Moxon read a paper in which she had prepared one-fifth of the states required humane instruction in the public schools, thus raising the standard of humanity. She said, "There are few crimes or vices which do not originate with the child, and therefore, to teach the law of kindness is to weaken the tendency to vice and crime generally and never can this be done so effectively as in early years."

The sanitary committee of the league again reported, advocating the enforced use of covered garbage cans; and Mrs. Cohen, for the committee on children's playgrounds, reported the prospects excellent for obtaining such playgrounds. A petition was signed by members of the league asking the city council not to give a long lease on the Warm Springs, as the people are not in the not distant future. The women also decided that they would watch the local markets with reference to maintaining the pure food regime.

THE HEALTH OF THE STATE.

The April Bulletin of the state board of health is out today. It shows total deaths from all causes, 339; number of districts reporting no deaths, 90; localities free from disease, 72; cases of scarlet fever, 108; 15 deaths; smallpox, 81 cases; diphtheria, 36 cases; 8 deaths; typhoid fever, 13 cases; 7 deaths; whooping cough, 387 cases; 13 deaths; measles, 15 cases; no deaths; chickenpox, 79 cases; no deaths; pneumonia, 159 cases; no deaths; consumption, 14 cases; 8 deaths.
