

## MOVE STARTED TO PUT SHEETS BACK

Chief Pitt is Too "Promiscuous" In the Matter of Arresting The "Faithful."

DECIDEDLY INDEPENDENT.

"Americans" Talking of Repudiating Their Own Appointee So They Can Get Capt. Burbridge's Scalp.

There is a persistent rumor going the rounds that the "inner circle" of the "American" party has a scheme on to make a big stir in the police department, and that trouble will begin for somebody at tonight's meeting of the city council. Whether the first attack will be directed against Capt. J. B. Burbridge or against Chief of Police Pitt remains to be seen, but according to statements made by those who claim to be in a position to know, efforts are to be made to remove Chief Pitt first and then will follow, if the alleged plan is carried out, the removal of Capt. Burbridge.

### CARELESS IN HIS ARRESTS.

It is well known that there are certain ones in the "inner circle" who "have it in" for Chief Pitt because he aspires to be chief of police in fact and does not care to tolerate some other man's collar around his neck. His oft-repeated statement that he would arrest a violator of the law no matter who he is, where he comes from or of what political faith he belongs to, was not well received by certain members of the gang which is determined to rule or ruin.

### SURPRISE AWAITS THEM.

Several times the disgruntled ones thought they had the police department in their grasp. They started out with the object of removing Burbridge. Failing in this they will now attempt, it is said, to remove Pitt and then get Burbridge. But there are factions in the governing body of the "American" party and the "inner circle" is likely to receive another big surprise.

### PITT WITHIN THE "LOOT."

Tom Pitt is an "American" party appointee. If he is removed it will mean only one thing—that he is expunged from the party which appointed him. Right here comes the split. Pitt did not seek the office but was begged to take it following the resignations of Burbridge, Sheets and later Roderick McKendzie, and now that the "rule or ruin gang" want him removed for the purpose of placing George Sheets in the chief's chair, there is likely to be the merriest kind of a fight.

### PITT'S SCALP FIRST.

It is said on good authority that no attempt will be made to remove Capt. Burbridge until Pitt is disposed of. It is further said that the mayor, or the mayor pro tem, may declare to send to the council a communication removing the captain. The only way this could be effected by the council would be for that body to adopt a resolution abolishing the office of "captain of police," and this could not well be done without the bitterest kind of a fight.

### BACK FROM CALIFORNIA.

Hon. W. W. Ritter Says San Francisco Has Hard Row to Hoe.

Hon. W. W. Ritter returned this morning from Los Angeles with his family, who have been spending part of the winter in southern California. Mr. Ritter found business conditions quiet all up the coast, where combinations of adverse circumstances and conditions are making commercial recuperation somewhat strenuous. First, there was the earthquake, then the great fire, the two rapid and often unaccountable expenditures of money, the removal of many desirable citizens from the state, the bubonic plague, the cyclone of strikes, and now the hard winter. However, the agricultural interests of California are prosperous, and as agriculture is the great foundation of prosperity, there are just hopes and expectations of a general renaissance at no distant day. The orange and other crops are moving well, and apparently profitably.

## VAST RUINS ARE BEING UNEARTHED

James H. Moyle Says Mexican Government Has Enlightened Interest in Them.

Where Hieroglyphics Are Found They Are Gathered Up and Preserved.

That the Mexican government, with a more enlightened regard for the value of ancient antiquities than the Spanish conquerors, boasting a more developed civilization, ever had, is now doing a wonderful work in the countries to the south, is the opinion of James H. Moyle. Mr. Moyle has just returned from Mexico and he has gone over a large number of the ruins new being uncovered.

"This work," he declares, "has the largest significance. I would like to keep in touch with it, and I should think it would be a fine idea for some local paper to watch developments, and to continue to do them."

A week ago yesterday I was at the Pueblo ruins, where the great pyramid of the sun, sitting on a ten acre base, and rising 174 feet, is being unearthed—that is being freed from the ashes, debris, and lava that was overlying it.

### HISTORY OF THE RUINS.

"The history of these ruins is that the Aztecs, the last ruler of which race was Montezuma, found them there when they came into the country, and that the Toltecs found them there when they came in. About the ruins of Cholula, a pyramid eight miles from Puebla there groups a legend that the Aztecs believed that this pyramid, which covers a base of 20 acres, was built by a race of giants who wished to reach the sun and who were extinct long before the Aztecs reached the country."

"With me on my visit was J. H. Price, a magazine writer who was preparing an article for a Ft. Worth magazine. He knew nothing of the Mormon belief in regard to ancient American history. Yet he continually mentioned the significant resemblance between the carvings about the pyramids and the Egyptian pyramids with their bas relief carvings."

### JAREDITE MIGRATION.

The Book of Mormon would explain these ruins as being those of the Jaredite migration to America, which built up a civilization with its center and its great cities for 1,600 years in one locality, below the Gulf of California, and north of the isthmus. It is this section where the remains are found, and this civilization was swept away, according to the Book of Mormon, before the lighter Nephite situation began to make itself felt, this civilization coming from a migration at the time of the fall of Jerusalem, while the former had occurred at the time of the building of the Tower of Babel.

### ANCIENT HIGHWAY.

"The government is so particular with these ruins," declared Mr. Moyle, "that they have enclosed sections of walls that have been unearthed in glass, to preserve them, just as found, and rocks bearing hieroglyphics have been collected and placed in position where they can be preserved."

"I walked for four miles down a perfectly preserved road which must have been the ancient city's main highway. It was built of cement and this had prevented the desert growth from getting a foothold, as it has elsewhere."

"When I was there the government had 200 men at work unearthing a house which was found beneath a lava bed, with stone steps 20 feet wide leading down to its lower compartments. There were 25 of them and at the bottom were found cement walls, enclosing rooms of spacious size, and from these led more rooms, which had not yet been cleared of their ruins."

### PLEASED WITH MEXICO.

Mr. Moyle spent several weeks in Mexican cities, and he declares the country is one of the best governed in the world; that life and property are absolutely safe and that great numbers of Americans are taking up their abode in the country.

## COMPANY FORGOT TO CURE

So Louis Pierucci Was Blown Up. He Says In Complaint.

WANTS \$20,000 OF UTAH FUEL

Mining Corporation Sued for That Amount and Case Transferred To Federal Court.

A \$20,000 damage suit against the Utah Fuel company was transferred to the federal court from the Third judicial district court this morning. Louis Pierucci, an Italian, is the plaintiff, and the case was transferred to comply with the "foreign corporation" law. The complaint sets forth that the plaintiff was employed in the Utah Fuel company's mine, No. 1, at Sunnyside, on and about April 22, 1907. Through the company's criminal carelessness, it alleges the complaint, an explosion in one of the lower levels occurred and the plaintiff was frightfully cut, maimed and permanently blinded and injured and his hearing destroyed.

Interesting about the ordinary is the complaint. It explains that the mine was in the habit of being used by use of electricity. At 5:30 o'clock each evening and morning a current was sent down into the various levels and connections would lead the "jules" to the caps and powder deposited in the faces of the different tunnels, walls, etc. At 3 o'clock the current was supposed to be sent off and the connections from the feed wires cut.

But on this particular day—April 22, 1907—the complaint says, the company forgot to disconnect. The plaintiff says that at the time of the accident, he was in the mine, and while he was doing this an explosion took place near him. Rock and gravel were thrown about with terrific force and the plaintiff was thrown to the ground cut and bruised all over his body. As a result he was laid off 60 days and as he was getting up at the time of the accident, he wants \$20 for the rest of the \$20,000 for personal injuries. Bailey & Vickery represent the Italian.
