It is all a shallow trick to divert attention from the main issue. There is nothing in the proposed anti-autoon beg-Istation which by the wildest stretch of fancy can be construed as favorable to the sale of liquor in drugstores. And if there is, make such restrictions and safeguards in respect to Bruor-selling that nine druggists out of every ten would rather cut out liquor entirely from his stock than run the risk of fulling to comply with the law's conditions. But give us a law that closes the saloons and makes the suloon traffic illegal. That is what the people demand, 75,000 strong. They do not ask for a local option bill with fares rogulation. Read the hand-writing on the wall. There is not a word of local option in it. Local option is simply of toring the soverelign people a stone for basic and a serpent for fish. It can be done, but not safely.


