The English Lord Chancellor gets \$2,000 for reading the Queen's speech.

The General Winfield Scott home-stand, in Elizabeth, N. J., has been sold for \$9,750.

A flying machine has been invented by a citizen of Harrisburg, Pa. The wings are each fifteen feet in length.

One thousand English sparrows have been imported into the public squares of Philadelphia.

The town of Elko is beautifully located in the centre of a nice valley, on the banks of the Humboldt river.

Tennessee presents for the "champion-ship" a lady of 114, who has 400 descendants and rides on horseback.

Sir John F. Fitzgerald is the senior General of the British army, and has had over seventy-five years' service.

It is said when a Russian husband neglects to beat his wife for a month or two, she begins to be alarmed at his indifference.

The London Telegraph says that it has been decided to reduce the strength of the British forces in Canada by 5,000 men.

A town in Mississippi has begun a raid on swarers, and numerous individuals have been already convicted and fined.

The Sheriff of New York City has an income of \$100,000 a year. The fees of Ludlow street jail yield him \$35,000 per annum.

The wealthiest man in America, is a young man named Stevens, son of the late Edwin A. Stevens, who when he reaches his majority will be worth \$150,000,000, by the advance of his estate in New Jersey.

He has lately been preaching at the Midnight Mission houses in London, and with such force that many women fell insensible, and had to be removed on stretchers.

The critics are hard to please. If a manager brings out a play in a hurried, indifferent manner, they pounce upon him. If he does not play Shakespeare, they scold him for not upholding "the legitimate." Now, a critic of a weekly paper in New York grumbles at Wallack and Booth for bringing out Shakespeare in good style, and thus makes him subordinate to the scene-painter and stage carpenter, and further adds that the public don't want to hear Shakespeare, and that these elaborate revivals are a great mistake.

Many persons cavil at the costliness of our churches and religious observances. But those of the unchristianized nations are found to be far more expensive. A missionary in China took pains to collect statistics as to the cost of idolatrous worship in that country. He reported that in one district in Shanghai, at least \$15,000 are expended annually to appease the souls of the dead. As there are 1,000 districts in the Empire, some spending more and some less, the average would give nearly \$30,000,000 spent for the Hien gods. In the same manner it is estimated that \$31,752,000 are expended annually for the Foo gods. Add to this the amount spent in each family for the worship of its ancestors, say \$150 to each family, and with 80,000,000 families of five persons each, the aggregate is \$120,000,000. Cut these figures down a half or three-fourths even, and the amount is still greater than is given to all Christian objects in this country.
