

NIGHT RIDERS BY COMPULSION

Generally Admitted That Men Were Forced to Ride With Outlaw Bands.

GOV. PATTERSON VERY ACTIVE

Charged With Exceeding His Authority in Ordering Out Militia to Make Arrests.

Camp Nemo, Tenn., Nov. 6.—Nine alleged "night riders" were taken to Union City today under the charge of Capt. Cappel of Memphis, with a guard of 12 men.

John Corran stated today that he was a "night rider" by compulsion. It is generally admitted that a number of men were forced to ride with the outlaw bands.

Frank James, one of the prisoners, said today that he was a distant relative of Frank James, the famous outlaw.

GOVERNOR ACTIVE.

Union City, Tenn., Nov. 6.—Eleven prisoners, held in connection with night rider depredations in the Reelfoot region, were brought into Judge Jones' court here today under heavy military guard.

Memphis, Tenn., Nov. 6.—W. J. McKelton, a farmer of Plum Point, who the federal authorities assert has been endeavoring to organize a band of night riders, was brought to Memphis today, and in default of \$5,000 bond was remanded to jail.

EARTHQUAKE IN GERMANY.

Plauen, Germany, Nov. 6.—The most violent earthquake ever experienced here terrified the inhabitants of the city at 5:40 o'clock this morning. Houses were shaken and the people fled panic-stricken into the streets. The shock, which lasted for several minutes, was accompanied by sharp explosions and thunderous rumblings in the earth.

CHARLES F. MURPHY DENIES TREACHERY

Tammany Hall Leader Says That Bryan Was Loyally Supported.

PLENTY OF PROOF OF THIS

But Before the Convention Democratic Chiefs Knew Bryan Could Not Carry New York.

New York, Nov. 6.—Charles F. Murphy, leader of Tammany hall, detested a statement tonight in which he denied specifically that Tammany Hall did not support Bryan.

'It is silly to accuse Tammany Hall of knifing the national Democratic ticket, taking all the circumstances into consideration,' said Mr. Murphy. 'Many persons who are making the charge know better, but hope to make political capital at Tammany's expense.'

'There is plenty of proof that Tammany was absolutely loyal. The fact that the Democratic candidate on the county ticket received less than the normal Democratic majority is proof enough in itself that Tammany was not in any way responsible for the Bryan slump. The county ticket suffered because of Bryan's weakness.'

FRANK SEMPLE DEAD.

Pittsburg, Nov. 6.—Frank Semple, who was in charge of the William Thaw estate and interested in the family institutions, died today of pneumonia, aged 75 years.

WEST VIRGINIA RETURNS.

Wheeling, W. Va., Nov. 6.—Completing return from 4 out of 24 counties give Taft 102,588 and Bryan, 78,340. Taft's plurality, 25,248.

PREST-ELECT TAFT OFF FOR A GOOD REST

Cincinnati, O., Nov. 6.—President-elect William H. Taft, Mrs. Taft and Fred W. Carpenter, private secretary, left this city tonight at 9:10 o'clock for Hot Springs, Va., where Mr. Taft will remain for rest and recreation until Thanksgiving.

The day has been the quietest for the president-elect of any he has had since election. He had a conference with Myron T. Herrick, but stated afterwards that no matters of significance were discussed. Judge Taft today sent this cablegram to Gov. Magooon at Havana: 'Please convey to the family of President Palma my sincere congratulations. He was an honored man, a true patriot, who understood the values and the responsibilities of liberty and who loved Cuba with all his heart.'

SCHWAB GOING TO CALIFORNIA.

San Francisco, Nov. 7.—It was announced today that Charles M. Schwab, of the steel corporation, left New York yesterday with this city as his destination, and that he is to spend two weeks in or about San Francisco preparing for a renewed activity on the part of the Union Iron Works, which is affiliated with the Schwab interests.

Washington, Nov. 7.—A decision was rendered by Corporation Counsel Thomas yesterday that hereafter hotels, restaurants, cafes, ice cream parlors, places where soda-water is sold, and barber shops in the District of Columbia will be compelled to serve colored persons in the same room and at the same price as white persons.

New York, Nov. 7.—Charles M. Schwab, president of the steel trust, closes his \$7,000,000 New York mansion today. He discharged all of his 50 servants, announcing that he no longer could afford to keep the great palace open.

GEN. WESTON'S HEALTH POOR.

Manila, Nov. 7.—The health of Maj. Gen. John F. Weston, commanding the division of the Philippines, has become a matter of such concern that unless his condition is improved he will probably request the war department at Washington, to relieve him of the command and depart for San Francisco, by the transport leaving in December. Maj. Gen. Weston has been slightly ill during a period of several months, but has bravely remained at his post in the hope that he would be able to serve out the period of his assignment to the division, which expires in June, 1909.
