#### A Land and Irrigation Company.

Articles of incorporation of the Central Utah Land and Irrigation company, U. S. A., have been filed with County Clerk, Alameda. The object in view is the establishing and conducting of a general stock farm, land and irrigation business within the Territory of Utah, and of holding property therein. The life of the corporation is to be fifty years unless sooner dissolved according to law. Salt Lake City will be the general place of business. The incorporation will be with the number of shares taken by each, W. H. Howe 19 shares, Frank Kline 16, U. W. Aldrich 10, G. W. Gruber 249, J. A. Robinson 239, Jno. M. Hoskinson 289, Wm. Pierce 224, L. M. Britton 1, J. A. Smith 1, and others.

The amount of the total stock is \$1,000,000, divided into 10,000 shares of \$100 each. Said stock is to be non-assessable and fully paid.

W. H. Howe is president, C. W. Aldrich vice-president, and Frank Kline secretary and treasurer.

#### Burned Missionary.
