ILIGO IS TO BE ATTACKED.

General Miller Will be Reinforced Within Twenty-four Hours.

IMMEDIATE ASSAULT EXPECTED

First Tennessee Regiment En route to Iligo—All is Quiet in Manila—Filipinos Are Entrenching Themselves—Soldiers Impatient of Restraint While Enemy is in Sight.

Washington, Feb. 8.—Probably within forty-eight hours Gen. Miller will have begun the attempt to recover Iligo on the island of Mindanao. No definite orders on this score have been given to the troops on these islands, but it is known to all that the commandant of Iligo Sunday last has been having frequent meetings respecting the matter. It was his known intention to make this important movement as soon as he felt that conditions warranted it, and instructions contained in the press reports from Manila convince the officials here that Gen. Miller has at last authorized the landing. The best indications of that determination was the despatch this morning from Manila of the First regiment of Tennessee volunteers, under command of Col. Miller, to Iligo. This movement might have been made some time ago, but for the necessity the commanding general was under orders of withdrawing the Fifty-first Iowa regiment from Iligo. Col. Miller had no time on their transports so long that they were ready only for active service until they had an opportunity of stretching themselves about for a few days. The last time they had been ashore was at Bontoc on orders from San Francisco for supplies. Gen. Miller will bring the Philistines there will be reinforced to the measure of twenty-four hours by the First Tennessee regiment, making a force equal to the population of Iligo.

New York, Feb. 8.—A dispatch to the Tribune from Iligo says:

Railroads Blocked in New York State by Snow Drifts—Damage to Property.

Long Island Sound Swept by High Tides—Shipwrecks Off New Haven Harbor.

New York, Feb. 8.—Throughout New York State the past twenty-four hours all railroad traffic was delayed several hours. Short suburban lines were completely blocked by the snow, which on the level averaged a foot deep and in many places drifted twenty feet high.

The Hudson river overthrew its banks whenever it could get a chance, flooding back nine hundred yards, freight piers and wharves, and causing

heavy sea breaks on board, completely covering the after deck and washing overboard the apprentices, an officer and four sailors.
