STEVENSON'S JOURNEYING.

His Trip to the Colorado Settlements—Continuation With a Missouri.

To the Editor: In answer to your recent column extending back into the 1890s, I find myself making pencil traces, jotting down the incidents of his journey which goes as swiftly by. This time I am on the R. R. W. Railway, southward bound from Salt Lake, toward a land where my feet have never trod. Just on the tip of my tongue, I am endeavoring to recall "All about it." What a world of differences in the way of life are exposed. The contrast was soon witnessed in a moment, some brokenness. For more than 100 miles I could not look with contempt upon that maligned brokenness, who spoke words so different, so harsh and gruff, and so effectively to one of the passengers who was worthy of better treatment. On the Colorado there were more signs than we were leaving behind in Salt Lake City. This continued on up to Boulder's Mountain, the highest point on the line in Utah, it being 7,000 feet—while at Salt Lake City it is 4,200—5,400 feet higher than our city. It was 11:45 a. m. when we reached this elevation, with our hands. We were about 110 miles on our way East. At 12:15 p. m. we reached the town of an elevation of 10,120 feet, 147 miles from Ogden. At Louisville, before that, I was shown in a very interesting conversation with a gentleman who was born in Salt Lake. The settlement at Matamoras, at which we were staying, is among the wonders of the day. About 2,000 people are located there, and although the altitude is 7,000 feet, wheat, corn, hay and potatoes are raised abundantly. Some farmers raising 2,000 to 3,000 bushels of grain, fruit, melons and other vegetables are growing to maturity. This is a large and lovely valley, capable of sustaining a large population. 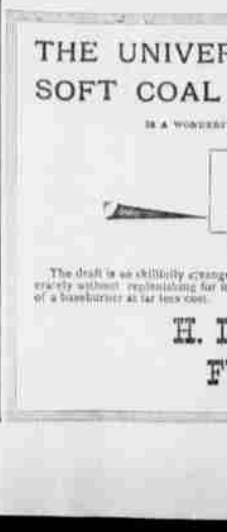

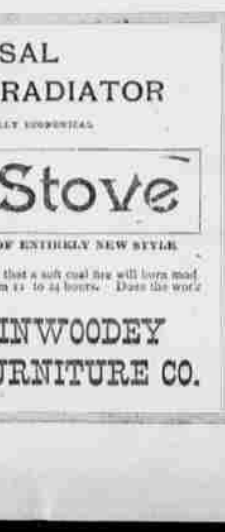
