Times.*

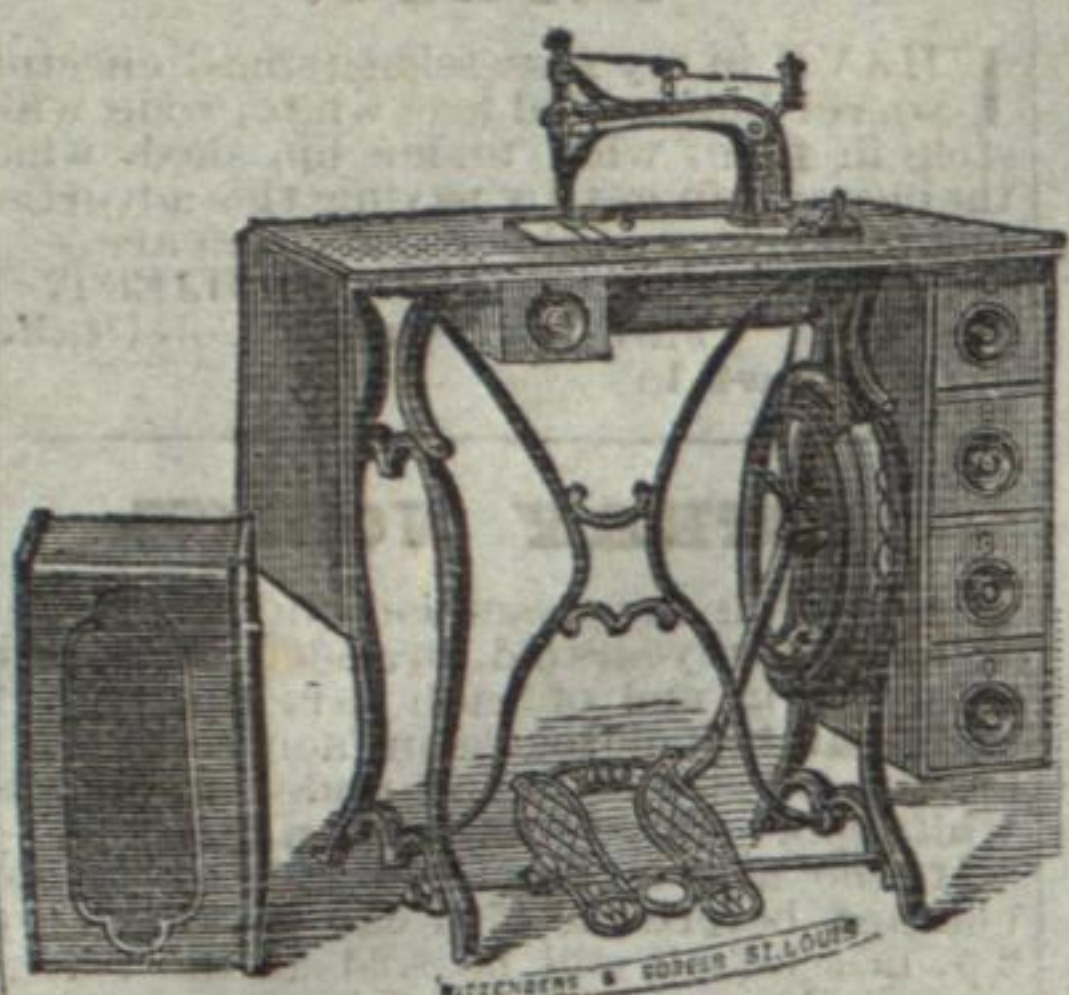
