FUNERAL OF JAMES WALSH.

Young Athlete Who Was Killed in Nevada Mine Is Laid to Rest.

The funeral of James W. Walsh, formerly of All Hallows college, remembered for his work on the college campus who died Monday at Pioche, Nev., from injuries sustained at a powder explosion in the Lopez mine, was held this morning at St. Mary's cathedral, burial taking place in the City ceme-

tery. Mr. Walsh, who was interested in the property with other Salt Lakers, was working in the main shaft when the accident occurred. He had ex-ploded a round of holes and after wait-ing a time for the smoke to clear away, returned to the face of the drift where the shooting was being done.
