FINANCE COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

On the Mayor's Contingent Fund—Sprinkling Contract Veto Gave It—From Utah Power Company.

Had it not been for the interference of Mr. Dale, Mr. Muley might possibly have struck Mr. Lloyd at last night's Council meeting. To Mr. Lloyd's credit it must be said that he maintained a perfect coolness, never once allowing his temper to get the better of him.

The trouble occurred over the report of Treasurer Muley on the number of billiard and pool tables in the city. The report showed the number to have been forty-seven, twenty of which licenses were being paid on, and twenty-seven were allowed to run free.

As soon as the report had been read, Councilman Lloyd arose and spoke with reference to the license on the way in which the ordinance on the licensing of pool and billiard tables was enforced. He pointed the Mayor as having said that he had not paid a license for a table in two years, and the Council table which had not paid any license since February 25, 1906.

Consolidated Muley, addressing himself to Lloyd, asked him if he was not doing business as a broker.

Lloyd replied in the negative. "Well you say," was Muley's reply, "and you have never paid a cent in your life, you ought to be the last man on earth to say anything for you represent nobody and nothing. I am surprised."

Lloyd—No one is more surprised than I am to find a Councilman evading the payment of this license.

Muley (continuing)—Why do you represent? Who are you talking for anyway?

Lloyd—I represent my constituents and (turning to the Mayor on the table) I propose to jealously guard their interests.

Muley then left his seat and walked over to Lloyd's table, who was standing addressing the Council and was heard to remark that he would slap him one.

Councilman Dale came between Muley and Lloyd, and President Sewell on motion of Mr. Muley requested Muley to return to his seat. Muley did as requested but immediately afterwards he was excused and left the Council chamber.

MAYOR'S CONTINGENT FUND.

The committee on finance who were authorized to audit and report on the condition of the Mayor's contingent fund, in a communication bearing date May 17, reports as follows:

The amount in said fund on January 1, 1906, when it was turned over to the present Mayor, was \$10,000. This was augmented in August 4, 1906, by \$1,000, placed there by the Mayor for the expense of the fire chief's convention.

We find that the whole \$11,000 has been disbursed by the Mayor prior to September 1, 1906, the time being shown by the auditor's statement of accounts attached and made a part of this report.

This was done and a report made to the committee by the recorder that the Mayor refused to give any statement at this time, saying that the Council had no control over this fund, but he would be responsible for all expenditures from it, and that he would report when he pleased.
