PARIS, 25.—The conflict of the city with the government in regard to the municipalities grant to the communists, has been compromised by confiding the distribution of the relief fund to the prefect of Zeine.

LONDON, 25.—A correspondent at Vienna says: A new spirit has been infused into the Russo-Russian relations. This is specially noticeable in the transactions relative to the evacuation of Turkish territory. Both sides seem to vie in friendliness. The Russian proposals relative to details were so fair that they were almost immediately agreed to. The impression is confirmed that the Russians themselves are anxious to leave.

A dispatch from Constantinople says Austria and Turkey continue to hold most conciliatory language, and declare themselves most anxious to come mutually to a satisfactory arrangement relative to the convention, but neither shows any symptoms of yielding on one essential point, viz: whether or not there is to be an express declaration that the occupation of Turkish provinces is merely provisional and temporary.

ST. PETERSBURG, 25.—The committee appointed to superintend the burning of infected houses in the plague districts, has begun operations.

LONDON, 26. Tremendous storms continue in the south of France, where hundreds of people are thrown on public charity by the destruction or inundation of houses.

In Spain the tempest lasted four days, and their was much damage and loss of life.

Various villages and farms in Navarre at Aturias were destroyed. A bark, name unknown, was wrecked at Corunna and thirty persons drowned.

The steamer *Memphis* from Liverpool for New Orleans, ashore at the entrance of the harbor of Corunna, has been abandoned. She is considered a complete wreck.

Prince Louis Napoleon and retinue sail in the steamer *Danube*, from Southampton, to-morrow, for the Cape to join the British forces in South Africa as volunteers. The Prince, in a letter to Rouher, announcing his intention of joining the British forces at the Cape, says: "For the last eight years I have been the guest of England. My education was completed in the English military school. I have strengthened my ties of friendship with the English army by taking part in its annual manoeuvres. The war at the Cape having assumed a more serious character, I have wished to follow the campaign. I could not refrain from sharing the dangers and fatigues of the troops among whom I have so many friends. Moreover, the time spent in witnessing this struggle of civilization against barbarism will not be wasted for me."

Government has chartered the steamer *Andeu* to carry a portion of artillery to the Cape. This is the 16th steamer chartered to carry troops and war material to South Africa.

Charles Peace, the notorious burglar and murderer, recently convicted of the murder of Arthur Dyson, civil engineer, at Banner Cross, on the 19th of November, 1876, was executed at Leeds, yesterday.

VIENNA, 26.—A telegram from the Austro-German plague commission of Izaritz, says the commission meets with the greatest opposition from the Russian authorities in the execution of their duties.

Spotted typhus is announced to prevail in Eastern Galicia.
