MARY ANN MELLOR.

FATIGUE, Provo, Utah, Jan. 26.—Mary Ann Mellor died Saturday at Payne's Hospital, aged about 60 years. She was born in Warwick, England, and married in 1848 to a man with her parents who were young child to Lancaster, Lancashire. She was the mother of twelve children; she first heard the Gospel in Bradford, Yorkshire, whence she, with her husband and children, had moved to escape work. In 1851 her husband became ill and they moved to escape him; he came home and built their house and read the Bible to them. She died during the Civil War, in 1865, leaving a son, John, aged 18, and a daughter, Mary, aged 14. John, a carpenter, is now living in Salt Lake City, having married, in 1884, a widow, Anna, who has three sons, John, 16, George, 14, and William, 12, all of whom are here. John is a carpenter by trade, and is engaged in his business. He is a member of the First Ward meeting house. Mortuary services were held in the First Ward meeting house Monday night, followed by interment in the cemetery. Friends and relatives were received at Elders Hills. W. Lewis J. Smith, Wm. H.
