CAMPHON VS. PEA BUGS.—A correspondent of Heifers, Steers, and Oxen. at the Horticulturist says:—Four years ago last J. M. HORNER & COM the Horticultuist says:—Four years ago last spring, my seed peas were more than half destroyed by bugs, the largest and best varieties being most injured. The summer following I had boxes made, one for each variety; with a cover; and when the peas were gathered, I put into each box with two quarts of peas, from six to eight bits of gum camphor the size of a large peas and mixed. gum camphor the size of a large pet, and mixed them together, and then closed the box. The next spring there was not a pea injured. I have pursued this course every year since, and have not had one pea affected by bugs.
