ogden, Dec. 15 .- The operators of the 14 canning factories in Weber county have made an estimate of this year's run, which shows a wonderful output of canned goods to be sent to all parts of the west. During the season it is estimated that nearly 600,000,000 cases of two-and-one-half-pound cans of goods put up. Over one-half s immense output was canned towere mattes, the balance being divided be-tween small vegetables and fruits. For tomatoes alone the factories paid out rer \$200,000, and to employes over 00,000. The farmers received a raise tomatoes this year, the price paid most of the yield being \$10 per ton at the factories. The season was an ideal one for tomatoes, as there was plenty of moisture and the summer was giving the crop ample time ig, giving the crop ample time to en.
