1878, and went direct to Australia, where they ishored jointly for about two months At the expiration of this time, Elder Shreeve proceeded to New Zealand, leaving his com-

panion at Sidney, Australia. The latter then visited Melbourne, and atter, working there for about five months, set sail for

baptizing, g persons and at the end of 17 months was released to come home. He left Sidney on the 17th of June, with eight converts, on board the Australia, and stopped at

New Zealand, where Bro. Shreeve joined him with 22 immigrating Saints, six of whom were his own converts. The vessel next touched at Honolulu, where, after a day's pleasant visit with the Saints there, they left for home. Brother Shreeve, after leaving Brother May in Australia, arrived at Port Littleton,
