PERU DEFINES HER POSITION

She Has Never Admitted That Brazil Had Any Right to Territory in Dispute.

NO INSTANCE CAN BE FOUND.

Brazil Will Not Discuss Differences Until Military Force Sent to Territory is Withdrawn.

Washington, May 8 .. - In view of the statement made by the Brazilian legation defining Brazil's position in the boundary dispute with Peru, the Peruvian legation today made a counter statement to the following effect:

"Peru has never admitted that Brazil has any right whatsoever to the

territory in dispute "The treaty of 1851 contains no recognition in Brazil of rights as alleged by the Brazilian legation. The treaty is one of amity and commerce and made no reference as to the territory now in dispute.

"The Peruvian legation do's not know of any instance that can be cited in which Peru adm'ated any of Brazil's pretented rights. On the other hand, recent statements of Brazil's foreign office admit that the government at Lima always has asserted its claims and maintained its title over the region in dispute

"According to late reports it would seem that the government of Brazil, instead of framing its policy in accordance with the provisions of its constitution, which provides for the settlement of international disputes by arbitration, has assumed a hostile attitude and taken steps by no means conducive to the pacific solution it has pledged itself to seek.

"The Brazilian legation's statement that Peru took advantage of Brazil's trouble with Bolivia to send military forces to the headquarters of the rivers forces to the headquarters of the rivers Yuroa and Purus is unwarranted, as a Peruvian population always has existed there, as well as small garrisons to preserve order. According to press reports, one of these garrisons not long ago was assaulted by 200 Brazilian troops, with the result that some of the Peruvians were massacred and some made prisoners and taken to Manaos, where the Brazilian officials set them free, stating that neither the central nor local governments were responsible for such assault. Such would not have been the attitude of Brazilian officials towards the Peruvian soldiers had they thought for a moment they had invaded Brazillan territory. Peru today is desirous of resorting to arbitration, without demanding previous conditions.

STATEMENT OF BRAZIL. The Brazilian legation tonight issued the following additional statement regarding the boundary dispute with

"In the message addressed by Mr. Rodrigues Alvez, president of Brazil, on the occasion of the opening of con-gress, May 4, the following is said regarding to the relations between Bra-zil and the republics of Bolivia and

Peru:
"The difficulties which existed between Brazil and Bolivia were settled by the treaty of Petropolis, which, unby the treaty of Petropolis, which, un-der a loyal execution, will contribute to strengthen the friendly relations of the two peoples and develop their com-mercial intercourse. By that treaty Brazil recovered nearly all of the ter-ritories of the Alto Purus and Alto Yu-rua, which had been ceded to Bolivia by the treaty of 1867, and containing for many years a numerous Brazilian for many years a numerous Brazilian population, and acquired, moreover, a right to the territories which Bolivia claimed on the basin of the Usuale to claimed on the basin of the Usuale to the north of eleventh degree southern latitude. The Peruvian government wished that her representative parti-cipate in the negotiations, and soon after proposed that the boundary ques-tions between the three countries be submitted to arbitration.

The Brazilian government could not accede to these proposals, on the con-sideration that it was simpler and more practical to discuss first with one of the litigants and then come to an understanding with the other. Such was questions, and such was the course also followed by Peru, when, in 1851, she first negotiated with Brazil and afterwards with Ecuador and Colombia, and

Now the treaty of Petropolis, Peru is in a position to negotiate separately and settle with less difficulty her bounquestions with Brazil and Bolivia. The rights Peru pretends to have were reserved. Bruzil does not refuse to take cognizance of her pretensions, but will not enter into discussion before the military forces sent by the Peruvian government to the Alto Yurao and Alto Purus are withdrawn. CONFERENCE ON EVILS OF DIVORCE.

Fourteen Leading Denominations Issue an Appeal to the Country On the Subject.

CAMPAICN OF EDUCATION

Too Much Anxiety About Utah Blinds Those Interested to Worse Conditions Nearer Home.

Philadelphia, May 8.-The interhurch conference on marriage and divorce, a body representing officially 14 leading denominations, has issued through its secretary, Rev. William H. Roberts, D. D., an appeal to the public, calling attention to several aspects of the divorce question.

The paper is the beginning of a national campaign of education on the subject, to be followed by efforts to secure the enactment of laws in the state legislatures, and ultimately, it is thought, of an amendment to the Constitution of the United States.

Already action has been taken by the Already action has been taken by the conference looking toward the prayer tion of the remarriage, by ministers of other communions of divorcees whom clergymen of their own fath have refused to marry.

This movement is the first occasion of any sort upon which the representaofficially come together. The members of the conference include many of the most eminent ecclesiastics and laymen in the churches. The appeal says:

THE APPEAL.

"Before any civil legislation can be enacted which will be operative, and quite apart from the accord which we are seeking to secure in the marriage regulations of the Christian churches, must come the leavening of the minds of men and women which shall lift them toward a recognition of the no-

blest dignities of life.
"We plead for a recognition of the sanctity of marriage. We are facing a condition in our country today which threatens danger to the most sacred things. The very sanctuary of human life and of human love is assaulted and profaned. Manhood, womanhood and childhood, the home and the family, are involved, and neither civil legisla-tion nor ecclestiastical discipline can ave them, until and unless the conscience of Christian humanity is reached. Behind the monster of polygamy, behind the spectable of the divorce court, with its collusions, corruptions and its contagion, stands the sad fact of the low ideal of mar-



TO CURE DIVORCE EVIL.

"The hope of curing and crushing the horrible tendencies to facile and frequent divorce rests, we believe, upon impressing and inculcating such intense conviction of what marriage is and of what marriage means, that it will cease to be entered into "unadvisedly or lightly," that the festivity which accompanies it shall be sobered and consecrated by the conscious presence of Him who adorned and beautified the marriage at Cana in Galilee by His presence and first miracle that He wrought; that neither man nor woman shall dare to enter the precincts of bethrotal without the tested certainty of love, with the full recognition of the mutual duty of service, forbearance and faithfulness which it involves.

DIVORCE STATISTICS.

"What words can we find to expres the abhorrence which ought to rise in righteous indignation against the present possibilities and the existing facts of the divorce habit in America? Just now polygamous Utah looms large and ugly in our minds, but we must look ugly in our minds, but we must look nearer home to realize the true condition of things. The proportion of divorces to marriages in 1902 in eight states reporting statistics is as follows: In Maine, 1 to 6; in New Hampshire, 1 to 8.; in Vermont, 1 to 10; in Massachusetts, to 1 to 16; in Rhode Island, 1 to 8; in Ohio, 1 to 8.8; in Indiana, 1 to 7.6; in Michigan, 1 to 11. In these states there has been a steady these states there has been a steady and rapid increase in the divorces dur-ing the decade, and this increase is believed to be true of the country at large.

UNHOLY DIVORCE.

"The fear of legalized polygamy in one state is enhanced by the fact of unholy divorce in many states. The faces of Christian people must be set against this. The voices of Christian people must be lifted against this, not only to secure civil legislation, not only to make the conference church discipling but to conf to enforce church discipline, but to correct the tendency, to control the inclination and to condemn the fact. We are pledwing for the home, for the family, for the children born and to be born, for the protection of society, and for the preservation of the state. We ask you to unite with us in earnest effort, so that more and more the maneffort, so that more and more the man hood, the womanhood and the child hood of America may make itself heard and felt, in the determined purpose to stem the currents which are sapping the foundations of all that is best and holiest and dearest in human life."

DEADLY POPULAR DEMONSTRATION.

During One at Tokio Over the Japanese Victories Twenty-One Persons Killed.

FORTY MORE WERE INJURED.

Tens of Thousands of People Carried Lanterns, Elags and Banners.

Tokio, May 9 .- During the popular demonstration last night in honor of the victories achieved by the Japanese forces, 21 persons were killed and 40 injured. The killed and injured were mostly boys, who were caught against closed gate at an angle in the old palace walls by the throng and crushed or drowned in an old moat.

A great popular demonstration was hele here last night in honor of the victories achieved by the Japanese army

Tens of thousands of people, carrying lanterns, flags and banners, marched past the imperial palace and the offices of the foreign, war and navy departments. At the navy department they were reviewed by some of the imperial princes and princesses and high officials of the government and the im-perial household.

Many bands of music accompanied the marchers, and there were beautiful

is ays of fireworks.

Dozens of American and British flags were carried by men, women and children who participated in the celebration. It was the greatest demon-stration ever witnessed in Japan.

Every supplemental report received from Gen. Kuroki, commanding the first Japanese army, increases the Rus-sian casualties in last Sunday's battle at Chiu-tien-Cheng, on the Yalu river. The Japanese have buried about 1,400 Russians and have 503 of the enemy's wounded in the field hospitals. It is estimated that the total Russian casualties exceeded 2,500. Over 300 Russian prisoners are en route to Matsuyama, where they are expected to arrive on Wednesday.

The Russians buried many of their

Natives in the vicinity of Feng Wang Cheng say that last Monday the Russians carried about 800 wounded through that place, and that their casu-

through that place, and that their casualties probably were above 3,000.

The casualties in the last attempt of the Japanese fleet to block Port Arthur, which took place on May 3, are one officer, Commander Takayangi, comanding the steamer Yedo Maru, and the steam six men killed, four men seriously and five officers and 11 men slightly wounded. Fourteen officers and 74 men are missing and eight officers and 36 men were rescued uninjured. All the offi-cers of the blocking ships, including Commander Takayangi, who was killed, have been decorated and granted annuities by the emperor. Last Friday, after sharp cavalry skir

mishes at Erhtaitsu, Santaisu and other places, a detachment of infantry belonging to Gen. Kuroki's army took Feng Wang Cheng. The Russians before retiring explod ed the magazine, but left large quanti-ties of hospital stores, which are being used by the Japanese hospitals.

Refugees from the woods and small vihages are surrendering. Gen. Kuroki, commander of the First Gen, Kuroki, commander of the First army corps, reports that on May 6 our cavalry detachment dispersed the enemy at Feng Wang Cheng, which was immediately occupied by our infantry detachment. The enemy burnt amunitions before evacuating the stronghold. Refugees of the enemy who have been hiding in the adjoining forests and vil-

lages continue to come out and sur-Natives say that the number of Russians who were carried on litters through Feng Wang Cheng on May 2 amounted to 300.
