CITY OF MEXICO, May 5.—The sub-

ject of the re-election of Diaz be-

came the uppermost topic and various

conflicting reports are current regard-

ing the attitude of prominent men

whose names are connected with the

presidency. General Carlos Pacheco,

minister of public works, who has

been regarded as the likely to be-

come the compromise candidate of the

various factions, was interviewed yester-

day. He was glad to be able to

give his views to the American people

at this time and would say in all

honesty that he personally favored the

re-election of Diaz.

As a measure certain to strengthen the

country and insure the continuance of

the present administration, he added:

"When I was governor of the state of

Morelos I proposed a change in the

constitution of the chief magistracy of

the republic, and therefore have not

noted to modify my opinion." He added

that many officers who fought under

General Diaz against the administration

of President Laredo on the issue of

no re-election had now altered their

views, seeing that it was necessary un-

der the change of condition and times,

to give entire liberty to the people to

decide whether or not they desired a

continuation of the present adminis-

tration. On being asked directly if Gen-

eral Diaz would accept a second term

he replied that he was himself very

little of a politician, being absorbed in

questions relating to the internal de-

velopment of the country.
