

GREAT GUNS.—Wrought iron guns, of monster size and calibre, are in course of manufacture at the iron works of Messrs. Nasmyth, near Manchester. They will be upwards of three feet in diameter, and about twelve feet long, weighing upwards of twenty tons each, and will discharge a shell of at least 1,000 pounds weight a distance of about five miles. The forge and machinery especially required for the manufacture have cost £10,000.

TO PREVENT BOTS IN HORSES.—A person of much experience in veterinary science is never troubled with this disease in his horses. His simple practice during the fall months is to keep a greasy cloth in the stable, and once a week rub with it such parts of the animal as may have been attacked by the nit fly. Grease destroys and prevents the eggs from hatching.

FLEAS, BED BUGS, &c.—A writer in the Gardener's Chronicle recommends the use of oil of wormwood to keep off the insects above named. Put a few drops on a handkerchief or a piece of folded muslin, and put in the bed haunted by the enemy. It is said that neither of these tribes can bear wormwood.
