Be it enacted by the Governor and Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Utah, That "An act granting to Isaac Bullock and Lewis Robinson, the right to erect ferries across Green river and control the same," approved Dec. 27, 1855, is hereby amended by striking out the words "Provided that nothing herein shall justify the parties in taking more than one third over the within specified rates of toll," in the fifth, sixth and seventh lines of section third, in said act. Approved January 14, 1857.

Sec. 2. When this appropriation is expended and the work accepted by the Territorial Road Commissioner, he shall give a certificate to each undertaker, certifying the amount he is entitled to, which certificate shall be a voncher for the Auditor of Public Accounts to draw a warrant on the treasury for the amount. Approved January 15, 1857.
