NEWS OF THE DAY.

There has been a mutiny among the crew of the new cable steamer *Faraday*.

A Peruvian steamer has failed and has caused the ruin of a good many families who entrusted their means to his keeping; his liabilities are two and a half millions; his assets less than a third of that sum.

A Western dispatch says that Jack Brannan, a San Francisco rough, was shot and mortally wounded at Virginia, Nevada, on Saturday.

The son of a Dr. Wendell, of New York, has swindled the Valparaiso to the tune of thirty-two thousand pounds sterling.

The notorious Apache chief, Cochise, died on the 9th instant.

The steamer *Prince Alfred*, from Victoria to San Francisco, sank, on Saturday, when about six miles from the latter harbor; the passengers and mails were saved.

A fire at Sand Lake, N. Y., on Saturday morning, did \$80,000 damage.

A London letter to New York, says that on the 13th of March the British ship of war *Duquesne* captured a slave with two hundred and seventy-five Africans aboard.

The Indians are said to be stealing cattle near Fort Davis, Texas.

Miss Julia Greenfield, of Cincinnati, sixteen years old, was mortally burned last Friday night.

An Arkansas sheriff has been arrested at St. Louis, charged with embezzling five thousand dollars of the public funds.

A consistory will be held at the Vatican on the 22d instant.

In an international horse race at Paris, yesterday, the grand prize was won by the English colt "Trent."

The Louisiana delegation addressed the citizens of Philadelphia, on Saturday, appealing for aid for those overthrown by the Mississippi.

The schooner *Rover* grounded on the 7th inst., five persons were drowned.

A member of the Canadian Parliament was arrested for perjury, at Birmingham, N. Y., on Saturday last.

The committee on Territories, of the U. S. House of Representatives, have agreed to report another bill, especially for the benefit of Utah. It provides that no person guilty of bigamy or polygamy shall be allowed to represent any Territory in Congress.

A number of Chinese workmen, at Beaver Falls, Pa., recently attacked their superintendent with knives and pistols, because he refused to hand out their rations of rice. The police quelled the riot.

It is said that England has offered her services as mediator between Brazil and the Argentine Republic.

St. Croix, who struck Gambetta on the face with a stick, has been fined two hundred francs, ordered to pay the costs of the trial, and sentenced to six months' imprisonment. Serve him right!

Baron Von der Heydt, formerly Prussian minister of war, is dead.

A Charleston correspondent, writing to New York, says, there are more criminals in office in South Carolina than in any other State in the Union.

A man named Johnson was found dead, his skull crushed in the streets of Des Moines, Ia., yesterday.

Agricultural stables and fifteen trotting horses burned in Bristol co., Mass., on Saturday night.

A Madrid dispatch says it is rumored that eighteen mutinous Carlist officers have been shot by order of Don Carlos.

THE REPORT ABROAD.

A somewhat sensational report of the occurrence at the City Hall last Thursday was sent to some of the papers in the West and probably in the East. The San Francisco *Chronicle* thus comments:

"The threatened conflict between the United States military authorities at Salt Lake and the Mormon city officials has been precipitated even sooner than was anticipated, but has scarcely been worthy of being deemed more than a tempest in a teapot. The question at issue was not very important in itself, being merely whether the municipal authorities should punish offenders for infractions of city ordinances, or whether the offending boys in blue should be turned over to the townshippers to be punished for their misdeeds in the city's calaboose. It did assume importance, however, when the Mormon city officials intemperately proclaimed that they would disregard the order issued by the highest military authorities, when they manifested a malicious purpose to provoke an outrage by their arrest and detention upon frivolous pretexts of soldiers out on leave from Camp Douglas, General Sherman and the officers under his command had no other alternative, under their recent instructions from Washington, than to send the city to the verge of anarchy. Happily, the Mormon authorities did not attempt resistance, and the incident of the soldiers whom they had incarcerated in

their cells as a 'd. d.' was effected without employment of the arms of the United States in front of the city prison.

Soldiers are not arrested and detained in this city on frivolous pretexts, though a partisan, subsidized, lying press may make it appear that such is the case. Violent personal and physical assaults are not exactly frivolous pretexts, and are not so regarded by any impartial tribunal. There was no 'malicious purpose to provoke an outrage' on the part of the city authorities or any other local civil authorities. Citizens and visitors expect from the civil authorities protection from assaults in the public streets and elsewhere, no matter by whom committed. The local civil authorities have taken that view of the matter and have endeavored, by good laws and good administration thereof, to extend and insure that protection to all and from all, considering that no person, civil or military, is exempt from the operation of the law, or can be legally sustained in defying it.

Certain parties with a malicious purpose have carefully and venomously endeavored to work up an antagonism between the military and the local civil authorities, hoping thereby to incite an open conflict. But they have hitherto failed of this, through the prudent action of the authorities. The malicious purpose, however, still remains, and it succeeded in producing this late unpleasantness. The action of the military was based upon a lengthy and proper opinion of Judge Advocate General Holt, probably elicited by a partisan and partial representation of the situation. Judge Holt's opinion may be law to the military, but it is by no means the end of legal controversy to civilians.

In Thursday's occurrences, so far as we have been able to learn, no regular formal demand was made of the authorities by the military posse, and certainly not the least shadow of resistance was offered, any assertions of a hiring press to the contrary notwithstanding. It is true, the major commanding did demand, explicitly but very indirectly, of the military, 'But Mr. Higgs had no more to do with "that prisoner" than the Emperor of Russia had.'

We believe the local civil authorities thought and still think that the military is properly subordinate to civil law, in times of peace at least, and that the Supreme Court of the United States would sustain them in that position. Thinking so, they would naturally conclude that everywhere, outside of the limits of regularly constituted military posts, the military, wherein they violated the civil law, should be subject to its penalties, administered by the civil authorities, and they would like to have the matter authoritatively determined beyond controversy, as the peace and good order of the community and the liberties and the safety of the property, persons, and lives of the citizens depend, in a degree, upon this question, as shown conclusively by recent events.

Our shaft on the Grand Gulch Copper mine has been recently sunk and quantities of iron ore in vast quantities is in sight. Fruits and vegetables are being shipped to Pioche. It is thought that the origin of the trouble was there was to hinder us in the succeeding of our money from the money from us that was being saved up for that purpose, as it has been remarked, by some of the members of the settlement, that if this drain continued a little longer, we would not be able to pay for our land in time. It is very probable that in long there will be cases of fraud in land matters in this region made public and investigation entered into.

WASHINGTON NOTES.

WASHINGTON, June 12th.—Opponents of Poland's bill for punishing polygamy are struggling desperately to prevent the Senate's action. It is thought that the bill will pass, as it is supported by the English law, as defined and modified by the American courts, and the bill is the rule of decision in the Utah courts when not repugnant to the Federal Constitution and laws.

Governor Shepherd has taken his stock in the (Washington) *Star* newspaper. The other members of the company bought up his interest in equal proportions. The price paid was at the rate of fifty per cent. premium on the par value of the stock. It has long been an intention of the Philadelphia City.

The Senate Committee on Railroads to-day agreed to postpone the question of the terms of the Pacific railroad act, as introduced by the House, until the next session of Congress.—*Washington Star*, June 8.

THE UTAH BILL.—There is now not much doubt that the Senate will pass the Poland, or House Utah anti-polygamy bill, and with very slight amendments. The House will probably accept the amendment of Senator Frelinghuysen, and the bill will be passed. It will sign the bill. It is a long and rigorous, but its main features may be briefly summed up.
