

THE COUNTY COURT.

The Opening of Four-week North Street Opposed - Tax Refusing Bill.

At the session of the county court held last evening afternoon, all the members were present.

J. B. Morrison, clerk of the court of education, appeared before the court and stated that in 1893 city property had been sold for school taxes to the sum of \$2,275.25, which time has been made.

James Young et al appeared in opposition to the petition of Morrison et al, stating that Morrison had been appointed clerk of the court of education, and that they were not bound by his actions.

The salary of the next term of Morrison was increased from \$1 to \$2.50 per month. In view of the increased salary the inspector will be expected to travel over the southern portion of the county and inspect schools.

The contract between the county and A. M. Anderson, for the boring of three wells, one at Eleventh South and Fifth streets, another at Eleventh South and West Temple street, and the third at Eleventh South and Eighth East streets, at \$100 per well, was ratified.

The petition of Normal Stewart, W. H. Shearman, Jerome M. Carman and Sarah A. McPherson, for relief from tax sales, were granted.

A. D. Cely and E. H. Wicks, agents, asked for the release of certain property and for taxes. Granted in the county attorney.

Representative Cannon of the county attorney filed his report for the month of May as follows: Issued on May 1st, 27 minutes during the month, 11 discharged during the month, 9 issued on June 1st, 24 files.

Judge Harsh held a brief session of court this morning and the following cases were brought before him:
