

# Taft and Payne Hold Conference

After Aldrich and Cannon Told Their Troubles President Undertook to Bring Peace.

SEEMS TO HAVE HAD SUCCESS

Progressive Republican Senators Will Issue Statement Giving Position On Downward Revision.

Washington, July 21.—Better progress was made today by the tariff conference than on any day since the troublesome disputes were reached. Many paragraphs were settled without any renewal of hostilities.

President Taft is given credit for the smoothness of the conference. It developed that after Senator Aldrich and Speaker Cannon told their troubles to the president yesterday he undertook to bring the warring factions together. He ordered out his big touring car and went to Mr. Payne's home. Soon the chairman of the house ways and means committee and the president were riding out toward the country roads. The two talked over the situation. What they said will never be known, but Mr. Payne made no objection today to the taking up of subjects not involved in the White House program concerning raw materials.

The entire zinc schedule was adjusted. Splitter was made dutiable at 15 cents per pound, which is a reduction from the senate rate of 1 1/2 cents, and an increase from the house rate of 1 cent. All the senate differentials were adopted. Zinc in sheets will be dutiable at 1 1/2 cents, and sheets coated or plated with nickel or other metal at 2 1/2 cents. The house rate of 1 cent for old and worn out zinc will only be re-manufactured, was adopted.

"Hunston ore, which is used in the manufacture of ferro alloys, one of the chief component parts in the manufacture of tool steel and steel parts for automobiles, was made dutiable at 10 per cent ad valorem instead of 15 per cent as fixed by the senate.

The lead schedule and the products of lead were disposed of. The senate and house rates on lead ore were identical, the duty being 1 1/2 cents a pound. The house made pig lead dutiable at the same rate and the senate provided specifically for lead dross, lead bullion and pig lead at 2 1/2 cents a pound. This rate was reduced by the conference to 2 cents, and as a result 1/4 of a cent was removed from the senate rates on all of the paint derivatives.

Lemons will pay a duty of 1 1/2 cents a pound, the senate rate. This is an increase of 1/4 of a cent over the house rate and 1/2 of a cent over the Dingley rates.

Senator Borah tried to effect an agreement by which hides may be put on the free list. He said the plan he had to suggest had been submitted by the Tariff Commission.

This plan contemplates the adoption of a joint resolution giving the conference jurisdiction to re-open the question of reducing the duty on leather goods and in consideration of placing hides on the free list, to make sole leather dutiable at 5 per cent ad valorem, boots and shoes at 10 per cent, and to reduce the rates on harness in the same proportion. In view of the opposition in the senate to free hides, the indications are that a combination will be effected with the Democrats to defeat the Borah plan.

PROGRESSIVE REPUBLICAN SENATORS. Progressive Republican senators decided to issue a statement outlining their position on downward revision. Senator Cummins has been invited to take breakfast with President Taft tomorrow to discuss the attitude of the insurgents, and thereafter to be declared to withhold the statement until tomorrow.

There was also a meeting of about 20 of the "anti-free trade" material. The members of the house at which Representative Gaines of West Virginia, a member of the ways and means committee, presided.

A heavy drawback provision was taken up today with treasury officials. Charles P. Montgomery, chief of the customs division, declared the French substitution system, after which the house drawback feature is patterned, opened the way to fraud. Under it an article might be imported on the west coast and a certificate received by the importer. The article might be manufactured and enter into domestic trade, but the certificate could be used on the east coast and a drawback obtained upon exported articles which had been manufactured wholly from domestic materials. Treasury department officials take the position, however, that the risk of being defrauded is too great for the government to assume.

No action was taken on the drawback feature.

# WOULD AFFILIATE MINING INDUSTRIES

Western Federation of Miners' Convention Launches a Movement for That Purpose.

WILL CALL A CONFERENCE.

Provision Made for Selection of Seven Representatives from the Federation to Take Part.

Denver, July 21.—The Western Federation of Miners' convention this afternoon launched a movement to affiliate all labor organizations in the mining and correlative industries. The federation officers were authorized to issue a call for such a conference and provision was made for the selection of seven representatives from the federation to participate.

The convention also extended aid to the striking United Hatters of the East by levying an assessment of 25 cents per member for a strike fund. In the case of James Jensen and Frank Ewing, two members expelled by the Ely, Nev., local, the convention authorized the local to reinstate the men until such time as they can be given a trial in accordance with the examination of the federation. It having been shown that they were expelled without a hearing.

The conference authorized by today's resolution will include representatives of coal and metalliferous mining and the following correlative industries: Mills, smelters, coke ovens, tunneling and excavating for railroads, aqueducts, canals and all other work where the elements of mining in whole or in part are present. This movement is regarded by President Meyer as one of the most important steps ever taken by the federation.

The report of the committee on president's report is scheduled as the order of business of tomorrow's session. Opponents of President Meyer are tonight preparing for a lively fight.

NATIONAL AIM OF JAPAN IS PEACE. Narragansett Pier, R. I., July 21.—"The national aim of Japan is peace and the introduction of the natives of the accident to the Orient for the well being and prosperity of both," declared Kokiichi Misuro, the Japanese consul general at New York, at the annual banquet of the Commercial Law League of America tonight.

Consul General Misuro dwelt on the desire of Japan for peace, and affirmed that commerce today plays a more important part in bringing together the people of Japan and the United States, and, indeed, the people of all nations, than the sending of envoys and long dispatches.

JUDGE DAVID J. BREWER OPPOSES INCOME TAX. Milwaukee, July 21.—In his address before the Association of Agents of the Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance company in this city today, Judge David J. Brewer of the United States supreme court said in part: "Under the hue and cry of today we must have an income tax, which means a tax on incomes, and if power to tax all income is given the government, it will see the subject taxed, not out of their existence, but out of their vitality. The idea leads up to the question of placing the entire power in the control of the nation and the state is left out of the matter."

MRS. THAW'S BOOK. Harry's Prosecutors Criticized, Insanity Experts Scored. White Plains, N. Y., July 21.—The prosecutors of Harry Thaw are criticized and insanity experts scored in a 20-page booklet, which Mrs. Mary Copley Thaw, mother of Thaw, issued here today.

It bears the title, "The Secret Unveiled," and alleges the existence of a "cowardly combination" against Thaw and the taking of unusual, oppressive measures in his case. His entire sanity at present is strongly asserted. Mrs. Thaw refers bitterly to Dist. Atty. Jerome, who, she says, "has on four occasions left the responsibilities for his own district to pursue the case into a district in which, as he himself acknowledges, he has no jurisdiction."
