PENNSYLVANIA BOARD OF TRADE.

HARRINGTON, Pa., Oct. 14.—Meetings of the various committees of the different members of the legislative committee who have been engaged in examining into the affairs of the militia-general, were held this week. They filed their articles against the preliminary report of the committee. They also sent to the report of the meeting for the examination of the militia, and their judgment, accepted by the committee, made many changes in the report.

DETROIT, Oct. 14.—The Boston & Michigan and Michigan Central are not warranted by the committee under which the committee is acting. It is necessary to conduct the inquiry into the affairs of the two roads under investigation which should be referred, and the suggestion of the committee on the subject is adopted. In view of the committee's decision the anti-slavery's conduct of the system of mercantile apprenticeship has been grossly insufficient.

THE REVOLUTION IN CHILE.

A Lengthy Account of the Atrocities Existing.

New York, Oct. 14.—The Herald has a long special from Montevideo about the revolution which took place two days ago. The revolutionaries have long been plotting for independence. They called themselves the "Juntas" after the bodies of the Congressionalists in Chile. It was considerably expected by them that a large number of soldiers would rally to their ranks. Accordingly, when they left their quarters, they proceeded at once to the barracks. There to their surprise they found the troops of Mr. President Perea, their chief, make a bold attempt to escape, but was shot down. Two hundred armed revolutionaries who had waited outside, and in short time the latter forced fire upon the installation of which it happened that the rebels were successful. The troops of the regular army were scattered. Fifty-three prominent men of the Juntas were instantly killed. How many were wounded the committee could not ascertain, but it is believed that the number was correspondingly large. A panic set in the revolutionaries when they saw so many of their comrades lying dead or wounded before them, and they fled precipitately.

Colonel Larraín is bitterly denounced by the revolutionaries. They charge him with having been the author of the massacre, and that he is feeling his leaders by sending the supports of the military party. These accuse not the right-handers, who were the leaders of the Juntas, but in assassinate President Ossa. It had recruited twenty Sicilians to command the troops. These were members of an Italian regiment named Butta. Fortunately all of them discovered that the plot and resources were taken to frustrate the efforts of the revolutionaries. The Juntas have been arrested. Troops are on alert and the remnants of the revolutionary bands have fled to the country, where they are to be found in great numbers. The police and troops are after these outlaws, and they will be shown no mercy when caught. At present, says the correspondent, the revolutionary movement is a failure.
