ANARCHIST ENTERS

Fifty Armed Men Burn 15,000 Pounds of Tobacco at Brooksville.

At Birmingham Six Are Shot—At Woodford White Man Is Victim.

Brooksville, Ky., March 10.—Fifty or more night riders came into town early today in buggies and on horseback, and before they left 15,000 pounds of tobacco, belonging to Robert Stenton, one of the wealthiest planters in this section, had been burned. The men were heavily armed with shotguns and revolvers.

A number of the men went to the local exchange of the Bracken County Telephone company and kept guard over the operator, Miss Holton, so that word could be sent for assistance. The men attempted no violence nor did they destroy the warehouse but took the tobacco outside and set it on fire. After seeing that it was all destroyed, they departed as quietly as they came.

California Supreme Court Decides Against Prosecution's Application.

Indictment Was Defective.

It Failed to Avert That He Was Mayor And That Ruef Was a Political Boss.

San Francisco, March 9.—The supreme court this afternoon, by unanimous vote, handed down a decision denying the application of the prosecution in the San Francisco bribery-kraft cases for a rehearing, after a decision by the district court of appeals, in the case of former Mayor Eugene E. Schmitz, convicted of extortion in the French restaurant cases. Without a dissenting vote among the seven justices, the court sustained the appellate court in its decision that the indictment upon which Schmitz was convicted was defective, in that it did not aver that Schmitz was mayor, that Ruef, his co-defendant, was a political boss, practically in control of the city, that as such they were in a position to exercise power and undue influence over the police commissioners, and that it did not show that Schmitz resorted to unlawful means for threatening to have liquor licenses withheld.

Francis J. Heney Sums Up His Side of the Case in 65,000 Words.

BOSS PREPARED CONTRACT.

Special Prosecutor Refused to Grant Immunity—Rabbits Entered Affair Upon Their Own Motion.

San Francisco, March 10.—A voluminous affidavit, comprising about 65,000 words, was filed in Judge Lawlor's department of the superior court this morning by Asst. Dist. Atty. Francis J. Heney. It is in answer to affidavits previously presented by the attorneys for the defense in their efforts to have the indictment of Abraham Ruef for bribery annulled, chiefly on the ground that Ruef had been promised immunity by the prosecution. Heney's affidavit asserts, in substance:

DEPARTMENT STORE ESCAPES
