KANAB STAKE QUARTERLY CONFERENCE.

The Quarterly Conference convened at Kanab Meeting House, on Saturday and Sunday, September 4th and 5th, 1880.

There were present on the stand Howard O. Spencer and James L. Bunting of the Presidency, and Bishops Wm. D. Johnson Jr., of Kanab, H. B. M. Jolly, of Mt. Carmel, R. J. Cutler, of Glendale and Thos. W. Smith of Pahreah, also the Presidency of the Quorums and High Council.

Bishops Jolly, Cutler and Johnson also Elder Samuel Claridge and Patriarch Elijah Billingsley addressed the meeting on Saturday morning, and Prest. Bunting and Elder James A. Little in the afternoon.

On Sunday morning, Bishop Smith and Elder Stevens of Orderville, Allen Frost, James Leithead and James Lewis of Kanab spoke.

On Sunday afternoon, Elder John Oakley, Prest. Bunting and Bishop Wm. D. Johnson Jr. addressed the Saints. The statistical reports of Stake together with the Society reports were read and the general Church authorities as also the local authorities were sustained.

The bishops reported general good health in their wards, meetings well attended. Good crops have been raised, the waters have increased, and a spirit of union, good feeling and prosperity prevails. The necessity of the legal voters registering their names and attending to casting their votes—also of sowing fall grain, tithing, united order, cooperation, Sunday schools and other kindred subjects, were dwelt upon, together with missionary experience and exhortations to faithfulness, by the several speakers. An agreeable, instructive and enjoyable time was had.

A priesthood meeting was held at 7 o'clock in the evening, and conference adjourned till Dec. 4th and 5th to be held at Orderville.
