

SQUARE DEAL FOR JAPAN IS WANTED

President Tells Methodists He Desires Their Help in Giving Her One.

IS NO MERE SENTIMENTALIST

Not at All Afraid to Invoke the "Big Stick" if It Is Necessary.

Washington, Jan. 18.—Introduced by Bishop Cranston as the "Apostle of the Square Deal," President Roosevelt, in an address tonight at the African Methodist Episcopal Memorial M. E. church, which the late President McKinley attended, declared that he would not come before a Methodist gathering if it had not attempted to give him a square deal.

"In addition to the square deal in our own country," he continued, "I want the Methodists and others to help me give the square deal to Japan. I will see to it that in doing this our own citizenship is protected.

"You know I am not a mere sentimentalist. I am not in the least afraid of invoking the 'big stick' if it is necessary, but I should be ashamed to invoke it unless it was necessary. And I want to see us, while insisting on justice being done in equally careful to do justice to others. The national government, by agreement with the Japanese government and through the hearty and spontaneous initiative of the Japanese government, has been able to achieve a completely satisfactory solution of all possible difficulties, of all possible questions that could be at issue between our people and the Japanese people. It is only the federal government that has with wisdom and propriety dealt with these questions, and I ask all good Americans to see to it that no one, foolish nor do not, to their own harm and to the harm of the country, the arrangement that is now working out so satisfactorily to the government of the United States and the government of Japan."

The president declared that the Methodist church had been an inspiration to him during the seven and a half years of his presidency. He referred to the fact that this was the last public speech he would make in this city as president of the United States.

Preceding the president's address Bishop Hartwell spoke of the missionary work being done by the church in Africa.

Vice-President Fairbanks will speak at the closing of the jubilee, to be held tomorrow night in the Asbury M. E. church.

LINCOLN CENTENNIAL

Pres. Roosevelt Would Have Feb. 12, 1909, Set Apart as Holiday.

Washington, Jan. 18.—The president today sent to Congress a special message recommending the passage of a law authorizing him to issue a proclamation setting apart Feb. 12, 1909, as a special holiday in recognition of the centennial anniversary of the birth of Abraham Lincoln.

The message refers to the recommendation of the committee of the Grand Army of the Republic that Lincoln's birthday be observed as a national holiday. The message then adds:

"I regard the proposal as eminently proper. It will be from every standpoint desirable to observe this one hundredth anniversary of the birth of Abraham Lincoln as a special holiday. I recommend that Congress pass a law authorizing me to issue a proclamation setting this day as a special holiday."

Washington, Jan. 18.—The supreme court of the United States today decided against former President Moyer of the Western Federation of Miners in the damage suit brought by him against former Gov. Peabody of Colorado, on account of Moyer's imprisonment on the governor's order because of his alleged connection with riots at Telluride, Colorado, in 1904.

STILL STEALING PUBLIC DOMAIN

Secy. Garfield Informed That in Past Two Years \$110,000,000 Worth Has Been Gobbled.

ARE 32,000 DISTINCT CASES.

Of Alleged Frauds Utah Is Charged With 1,482—Wyoming Has Greatest Number.

Washington, Jan. 18.—Starting information of alleged astounding frauds upon the public lands has come into the possession of Secy. Garfield through special agents. The allegation is made that approximately \$110,000,000 worth of lands in states principally west of the Mississippi river have been fraudulently acquired within the last two years by corporations and individuals.

With a view of recovering these lands, Secy. Garfield today sent letters to Chairman Hale and Chairman Sawyer of the senate and house appropriation committees, respectively, asking for an additional appropriation of \$500,000, which, if granted, with that already asked for, will give the department \$1,000,000 for that purpose.

Secy. Garfield also submits a statement of H. H. Schwartz, chief of the field service, showing over 32,000 distinct cases of alleged land frauds demanding further investigation. Of such cases awaiting investigation, there are in Oregon 1,482; California and Nevada, 1,409; Washington and northern Idaho, 1,335; Montana, 3,295; Colorado, 8,621; Arizona, 106; Wyoming, 21,159; Utah, 1,482 and New Mexico, 1,582.

Chicago, Jan. 19.—In responding to an alarm early today the firemen found a man undressed and warming his hands in front of a blazing fire in a bedroom. When questioned he said he was George Washington at Valley Forge and that he had built the fire to get warm. The police by his side said he will be examined as to his sanity.

COMMODITIES CLAUSE.

Argument on Cases Reached in U. S. Supreme Court.

Washington, Jan. 18.—Argument in the commodities clause cases was reached today in the supreme court of the United States. Atty.-Gen. Bonaparte and Solicitor-Gen. Hoyt appeared for the government, and John D. Johnson of Philadelphia and Robert W. DeForest and Walker D. Hines of New York for the railroad companies.

The cases involve the constitutionality of the clause in the Hepburn rate law of 1906 prohibiting railroads from carrying their own products in interstate commerce.

The United States circuit court for the Eastern district of Pennsylvania decided against the law, and the government is asking the supreme court to reverse that decision.

There are 12 of the cases and all of them are directed against the anthracite coal roads.
