AN OLD FEUD SETTLED.

Local Skin Shot and Possibly Fatally Wounded.

Word was brought last night to Ogden that Marion Shoen, an old tenant of Plain City, the county, had been shot and probably fatally wounded by Joseph Mooney of the same place.

In the course of certain litigation wherein Shoen was defendant and Mooney, together with Wm. Breen, defendant in a damage suit. The suit was filed against Mooney for a recent injury through the Fourth district court and the Supreme court of the Territory.

The matter has rested heavily on the minds of the parties since it occurred a week ago until last night, when the two parties last met face to face on the sidewalk near Shoen's home on his return home after spending the day in this city. At that time Mooney was not present, but Shoen, knowing the feelings of vengeance that now possess the man, whipping his horse and would have made good his escape if he had not been overtaken by a party in the hands of Mooney who had come along and the affray was stopped.

Shoen was at once conveyed to his home and Drs. Powers and Clegg were summoned. The injuries are serious indeed and may prove fatal, but are not necessarily so. Mooney came in and gave himself up to the officers of the law and is now in the county jail awaiting a preliminary hearing.

City Council Meets.
