

ROOT CROPS VERSUS DRY FODDER.

Conclusive Results From Experiments Made at the Utah Station. Experiments as to the relative benefits of green and dry food for stock have been made by Professor (Hutchinson), one of the Utah stations. Of these the professor says that four years of trials with root crops against dry foods made by him in New Hampshire, several trials of similar crops against dry food, and the fact that dry grass against the same food in the green state have failed to confirm the popular belief that green food in the form mentioned has a greater nutritive value than dry food. In a bulletin issued later from the Utah station the professor outlines the results of feeding roots to cattle, sheep and hogs. An experiment was entered upon with horses, which was broken up by a serious accident to one of them. The following summary is drawn from these results: The live weight gains for cattle and sheep was greater for the legs less weight fed on roots. The dressed weight of cattle, sheep and hogs showed in every case greater advantage for those fed on roots. The root-fed animals maintained more blood, and consequently more water in blood. The result shows how better vital organs. The fat was always less for root-fed animals and affords a somewhat defective test of their relative value. Root-fed steers appeared to have less, more fat and as dry stock in general contained less fat. The water of the flesh in every case for cattle, sheep and hogs was far greater for the root-fed animals. The amount of dry matter for cattle, sheep and hogs was in all cases less for the root-fed animals. It is believed that the important differences in the nutritive value of the roots, which are the chief cause of the poor results derived from the roots. Thus and several previous trials lead to the belief that all the nutritive value of roots is not destroyed by drying but is less nutritive than nature would have it.
