

UNIQUE WATER STORAGE-IDEA

How Commissioner Armstrong Would Control Mountain Streams in Winter Time.

And How He Would Have Them Draw on When All Nature Is Dry.

According to information brought in from the Colorado, the last storm has piled up the snow to a great depth in the mountains. At Alto it was over four and one-half feet deep; higher up it was deeper, while near the mountains it was two feet to depth.

The snow this year came upon the ground while it was uniform, and thus means that it will thaw throughout the winter and sink into the earth instead of laying upon the frozen surface until some season to melt and be washed away when the water weather comes.

County Commissioner Armstrong is speaking of water supply and says to a "News" man that there were not many in the world who had more water than he does. This comes from different mountain streams during the summer months. However, he desires to have a feature in the Colorado as well as in the canyons which generally made it expensive to store the water. But nature had supplied a better method. A small stream at the foot of the hill had one at a time when it was needed. Anyone who has been in this country any length of time will know how rare a feature this is.

Mr. Armstrong's plan is to inflate nature. He says that with few small dams divert much of the water and a few men to keep the snow from melting on the flow of any of the mountain streams and change the water that otherwise would be wasted into streams.

He proposes to do this at various places along the streams where the fall is great above it to fall to spray and clinging to ice in the freezing weather below, and then melt as the temperature rises during the hot months. The reason, he declares, is obvious, as the wind and the avenue he seeks great quantities of snow, so as to attack the source of his water.

A paper containing the outlines of all his plans may be seen at the University offices of the University of the University of Colorado, and the greater the number of universities that see during the season of snow, the greater the quantity of water that will be diverted by his scheme.

Mr. Armstrong's plan is to inflate nature, he says, that with few small dams divert much of the water and a few men to keep the snow from melting on the flow of any of the mountain streams and change the water that otherwise would be wasted into streams.

It is difficult to believe, but the weather favors the water that would come to the mountains when it would be needed.

Mr. Armstrong concluded by saying that because his method was cheap it never had been tried but hoped to see his idea carried out some time.
