## XIX CONGRESS.

SENATE.

WASHINGTON, 5.—The Senate has

agreed to the amendment to the river

and harbor bill appropriating a million

dollars for the improvement of New

York harbor.

The next amendment on which there

was a discussion was one appropriating

\$300,000 for the improvement of the Potomac

river in the vicinity of Washington.

The bill was passed by a vote of 74

yeas to 23 nays, with 10 yeas and 10

nays in respect to which the title of the United States

was in doubt, or in respect to which

my claim adverse to the United States

had been made. The amendment was

agreed to.

After executive session, adjourned.
