PROSPECTS OF THAT IMPORTANT BRANCH OF HOME INDUSTRY BRIGHTENING.

Your readers doubtless remember that Zion's Central Board of Trade, at its session in the early part of October last, appointed a committee to investigate the merits of the manufacture of sugar from sorghum cane as a practicable and profitable industry in this Territory. Said committee consisted of six members: George Q. Cannon, Wm. Jennings, S. P. Teasdel, of Salt Lake, Harvey H. Cluff, of Provo, Wm

Paxman, of Nephi, and John W. Hess, of Farmington.
I am requested and authorized by this committee to inform you that they have held three meetings in this city, and have discussed and ventilated quite thoroughly the subject entrusted to them. The enterprise is growing in favor with them, and they purpose recommending the establishment of a business in this industry as soon as they can decide upon the *modus operandi* and can select a suitable and propitious location. With this object in view a sub-committee of two of their number has been appointed to act in conjunction with Bro. Stayner in the examination of the facilities of a certain locality in Salt Lake County, and the probability of making satisfactory arrangements therefor, to report at the next meeting on the 26th inst.
The close pressure of money matters at the present time renders their duty in this regard considerably more difficult, but they are endeavoring to get the business set up with as small an outlay of means as possible, and yet do justice to the magnitude and merits of the enterprise. 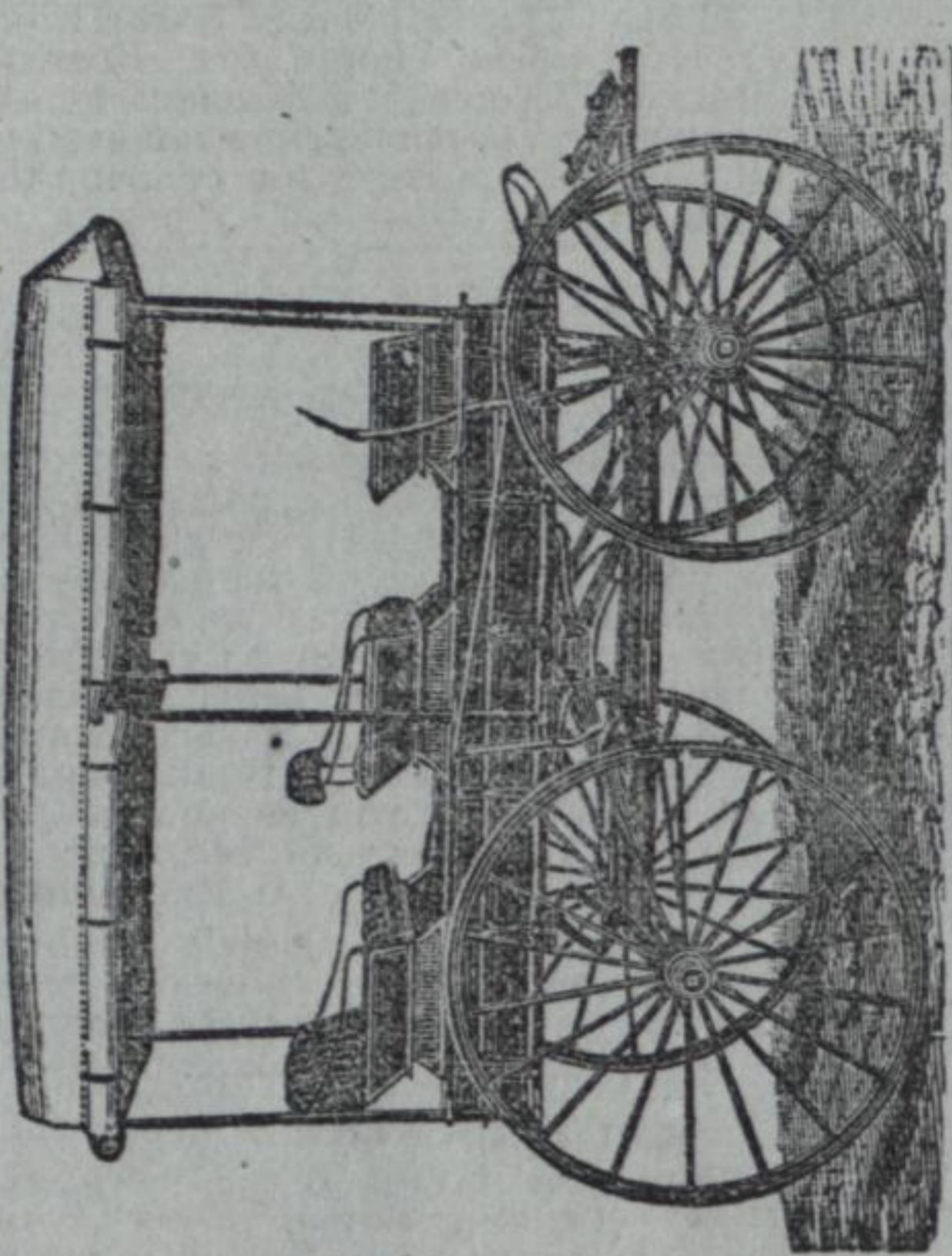

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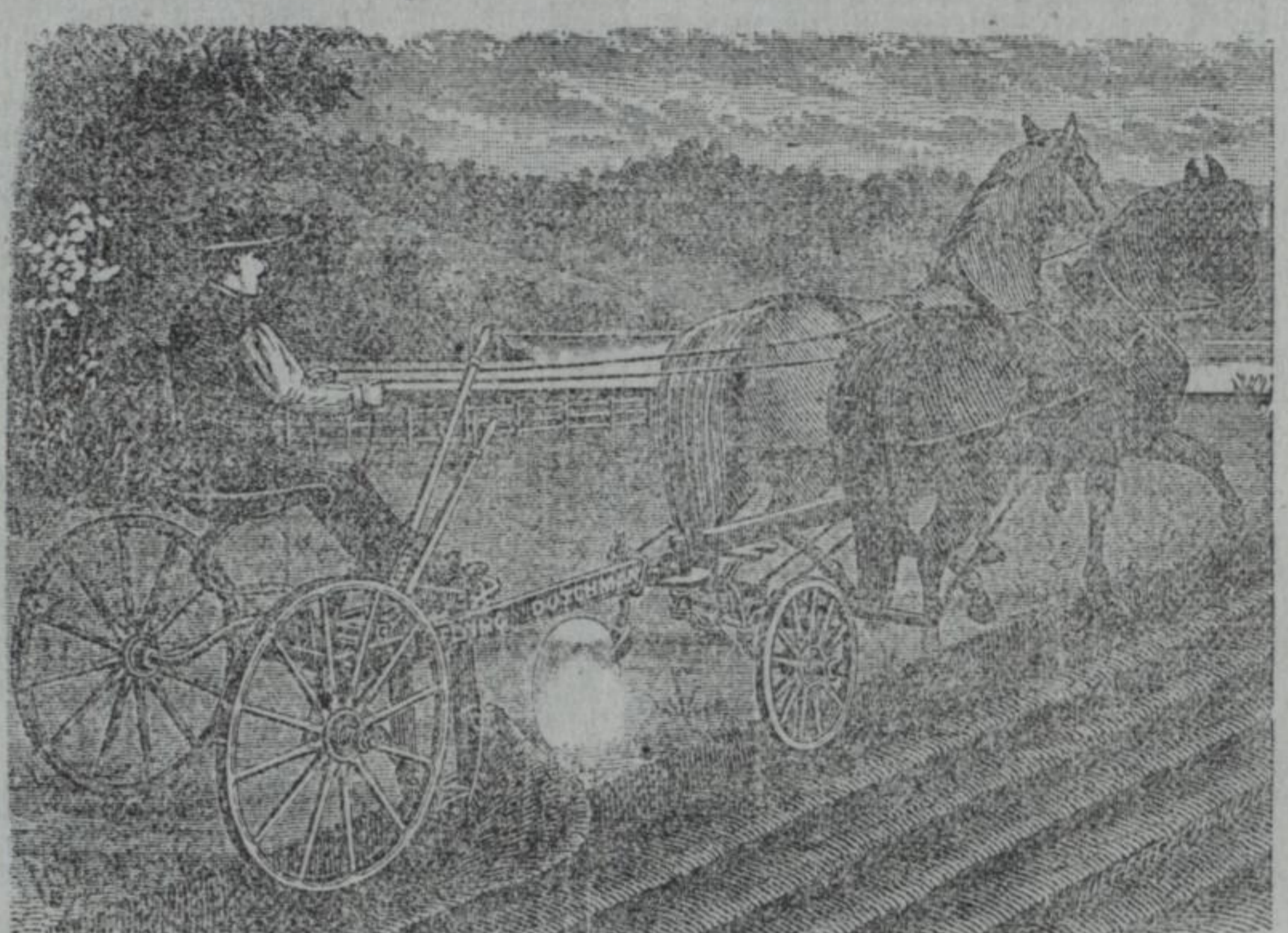
