will not irrigate a province. The garden engine is a pretty plaything, but useless in a conflagration.

It may be thought that New York is an exceptional city, and that the methods which have falled in this heterogenous and concentra-ted population may succeed per-fectly elsewhere. There are exceptional circumstances in this city One-fourth of the real estate is owned by a dezen individuals and corporations. One-half of our me-chanics and business men live out of town, and feel no special interest in our municipal affairs. But these circumstances have less effect upon the municipal administration than many people: imagine. Philadel-phia is a city of homes. Her houses are mostly occupied by owners, and have fewer occupants than ers, and have fewer occupants than those of any other city on this continent. Her business is diffused. Most of her business men live within the city lines. One would appose that in that quiet and orderly city the old mechanism of municipal administation would work without relation and produce work without friction, and produce the most admirable results. But, on the other hand, it has been found that her treasury has been systematically robbed for years, of immense sums, for which she has nothing whatever to show,

and she has been saddled with a debt even longer than our own. The difficulty is not in a few exceptional electromistances, but in a defective system of municipal government. The boy's garments do not fit the full-grown man. Here is Brookin, a city of residences, with no great business interests to provide for-a city for elegant retirement from the busile and dust of business attrects and commercial complications, which merely needs to be loop in order and adorned. And yet this quiet city—which, it would seem, should almost need no government at alle-has been shamelessly pillaged in all serts of ways, until every department of its government is covered with corruption, and its treasury is bankrupt, and their teaching conclusive. A large, heterogeneous, concentrated population, absorbed in private pursuits, cannot and will not give the requisite attention to the details of municipal politics. But experience proves that the inhabitants of these vast and cannot afford the time and patience requisite to follow out their details. Merchant like Stewart and Claffin and Lowe would sooner pay all the bills o

DESIBABLE EMIGRANTS.— The Chicago Statts Zeitung states that the report previously circulated that large bodies of Mennonitee from Russia and Prinssis are coming this summer to the United States, is true. It is no mere conjecture, but a fixed purpose. Last summer a leading Mennonite from Southeastern Russia made a tour of inspection through the United States and the Canadas, and now a committee of five Russians and now a committee of five Russians and one Prussian are on their way to New York. Some twenty or thirty families are expected to arrive here during the present summer, and five hundred more will follow them next summer.

The Mennonites are German Baptists, and akin to the Quakers in their hostility to war. They are industrious and thrifty, and are regarded as good citizens by both Russia and Prussia; but both these governments insist on their performing military duty, which they refuse to do and hence the present emigration.

There are considerable bodies of these people in various parts of Pennsylvania, the descendants of emigrants who came over generations ago. They are a valuable class in any community, and are highly esteemed by their neighbors. 
