colt of a zebra father-sent to Presi-dent Roosevelt by the emperor of Abys-sinia-and of a common American farm sinia--and of a common American farm mare. The Abyssinian zebra is the largest and most powerful of striped horses, and the blood of the zebra gen-erally is prized because that wild cre-ature of Africa is immune against many diseases of the horse. In the country of the Boers zebras are found to be proof against the active contr to be proof against that costly conta-gion known as "horse sickness" and to withstand the bite of the "tsetse" fly, so fatal to horses. A Scotch naturalist who has imported several zebras-of a species smaller than the Abyssinian to be used in our experiments-finds tha they possess remarkable endurance and powers of recovery from severe inju-ries. Their younds heal without swelling, fever or pus, and in two cases, where flaps of hide have been torn from where flaps of hide have been torn from them in accidents, the flesh has healed without scarring. Our horses, like many of our people, have degenerated. physically, from too much artificiality of life, and just as some royal families have profited by addition of blood from a more primitive stock so, it is believed, will our horse. The zebroid breeding experiments are being made industries.
