The machine did excellent work, binding equally firm and even in long and short train and not missing a single bandle. Notwitstanding the fact that the grain was

green and heavy, the elevator did perfect work, and the grain was bound so tight that it was next to impossible to shake the bundle out. Considering the incrperi-ence of the driver and team the acre of grain was cot in a netably short time and to the satisfaction of all present.
