

GOODESS STATE UNIVERSITIES

That is What Secretary of Pres-
byterian Board of Educa-
tion Calls Them.

VERY BITTER IN HIS ATTACK.

It Ministers Find Their Churches at a
Low Ebb They Know Where to
Place the Blame.

Denver, Colo., May 25.—"Grace is not
usually said over champagne and lob-
ster a la Newburg."
"Family altars are not raised over
Persian rugs."
"Students for the ministry do not, as
a rule, get their early training by run-
ning steam yachts."
"Most of us preachers come of hum-
ble beginnings."

These epigrams from a "fledgling sec-
retary," as he termed himself, caused
the general assembly of the Presby-
terian church, its one prominent divi-
ne, "to sit up and take notice" today.
The speaker was Dr. Joseph W. Coch-
ran, secretary of the Presbyterian
board of education.

Dr. Cochran, who is from Philadel-
phia, spoke in the afternoon on the re-
port of the board of education, which
deplored in unmistakable terms the lack
of recruits to the ministry. The re-
port was read by Dr. Edgar E. Hill of
Chicago, who stirred the assembly to
high pitch by his word picture of the
ignorance among immigrants, due to
the fact that no Protestant de-
omination, and surely not the Presby-
terian, has taken the trouble to stir up
a sufficient number of ministerial re-
cruits to work among these people. The
demand for more ministers was then
taken up by Dr. Cochran.

"Why can't we get the young men to
preach?" asked he. "I'll tell you. In
the first place there is but little Chris-
tianity in the home. There is any
it is gone by the time the young man
is ready for an education. Does he go
for his education to a Christian school—
Presbyterian school? No, he goes to a
godless state university, and when he
returns to his home town he puts re-
ligion at low ebb. And if you ministers
find your church is at low ebb, you
know where to place the blame. This
young man has been educated where
there is no Christianity."

STATE UNIVERSITIES ATTACKED.
"The need in this board of education
is not more money, but more men.
These young men must be taken in
hand when they are ready for an edu-
cation. They are not ready for it now.
Now, we cannot Christianize these state
universities, but we can put a shepherd
in charge of the flock, and in this way
keep these boys in the flock, although
they are being educated at godless
schools."

Dr. Cochran urged that Sunday school
teachers put before the boys the min-
istry as a career.
The report of the committee urged an
interdenominational immigration board
to work among the immigrants.
It also urged that evangelistic work
be carried on in the native tongues of
the immigrants, and for this purpose it
is suggested that ministers and
evangelists be trained in theological
schools where there is no religious
taint in the language that will enable
them to work among foreigners. Two Ger-
man theological schools were endorsed.
The Rev. H. L. Webber of Bloomfield,
N. J., one of the secretaries of the
board of education, urged the necessity
of teaching foreigners in their own
languages as a part of the home mission
work, and in connection with the
board of education.

The report of the special committee
on administrative agencies brought on
a hot debate in the afternoon. The re-
port, as read by Dr. Edgar E. Hill of
Pittsburgh college, recommended that
the various boards of the church seek
legal advice for the purpose of ascer-
taining the possibilities of enlargement
of administrative powers over the re-
spective churches. Dr. Moffat pointed out
that the laws of New York non-stock-
holding corporations would prohibit
from owning property in excess of \$5,
000,000, and that in case of a bequest it
ought work to the injury of the con-
siderable amount of property owned
various of the 14 recommendations
of the special committee were referred
to standing committees.

the pole of the Carnegie bequests.

IS INTERSTATE COMMERCE.

U. S. Supreme Court Says Can Ship
Liquor Into Local Option State.

Washington, May 24.—The supreme
court of the United States today decid-
ed the case of Adams Express com-
pany vs the Commonwealth of Kentucky,
involving the right of the express com-
pany to ship liquor into local option
country, contrary to the law of the state,
and to take it out of the state.
The opinion of the court, which was
written by Chief Justice Taft, was that

brothers. He was acquitted, the jury de-
claring his act was justifiable.

MUST PAY DEATH CLAIM.

Richmond, Va., May 25.—The United
States circuit court, appeals at Rich-
mond, has denied a hearing to a life
insurance company in the McCue case
as a result of which the company will
be compelled to pay the death claim
of \$50,000 on the life of J. S. McCue, for-
mer mayor of Charlottesville, Va., who
was hanged for wife murder. The com-
pany contested payment on the ground
that it was against public policy to
pay a claim on a man who was killed
by due process of law, and the decision
established a federal ruling on all cases
where policyholders are legally execu-
ted.

high above the street, the rope broke,
and the body fell to the ground, but
was immediately raised again and left
hanging. The mob, which was composed
of heavily armed deputies in the jail,
but these were soon overpowered.
Several prominent men made speeches
endeavoring to dissuade the mob, but
without effect.
