

# TELEGRAPHIC. REPUBLIC OF HAWAII.

President Dole's Proclamation on the Fourth of July.

THE CAUSE OF THE QUEEN DEAD.

The life of the newly launched Republic will be honored in the United States.

HONOLULU, July 4.—The provisional government is no more than the pupa of Hawaii until the return of power. It is still a change of name as the same people are in power, and the stated purpose of the government is no longer to sustain annexation with the United States.

The new constitution, which was promulgated on the first of July, from the time of its former existence. A large crowd was present, and when President Dole appeared, he was greeted by a noisy crowd, surrounded by an entire column of the military and naval members of the old constitution, he read the provisions of the new constitution to the crowd.

President Dole, president of the provisional government of the Hawaiian Islands, by virtue of the change given by the executive and legislative councils of the provisional government and by act dated July 3, 1893, proclaim the republic of Hawaii as the sovereign authority over and throughout the Hawaiian Islands from the time forth. And I declare the constitution framed and adopted by the convention of Hawaii, by virtue of this constitution, I now assume the office and the authority of the president thereof.

"Long live the republic!"

J. W. Kauai, one of the leading representatives, read the proclamation of independence, which was received with cheering and the ceremony was over.

A few evenings before the fourth the legislature held a mass meeting at which two thousand men, women and children, in protest against the formation of the existing, claiming that President Cleveland had not received the petition sent by the legislature asking to be restored to the throne. Copies of this resolution were sent to the president of the United States, and to the vice-president, who agreed that he would inform his government of the change.

In the eve of the fourth the annexationists held a big mass meeting for the purpose of ratifying this new constitution. It was a most enthusiastic meeting.

The popular having been informed, Minister Thurston will probably return to Washington soon. He was absent on the fourth, having gone to Victoria.

One of the royalist papers, the *Hawaiian*, which has been a raving sycophant of the royalists, has changed its color and is avowing all royalists to take the side of the annexationists to the exclusion of all others.

A royalist committee consisting of Samuel Parker, H. A. Williamson and John A. Cummins, have for Washington on the 1st January this afternoon, to meet the royalists, and to ascertain their views and try to state an answer to what he intends to do in the Hawaiian matter. Their expenses have been paid by prominent royalists and they carry a secretary with them.
