New York, April 21 .- Surgeons at the Plower hospital have just effected a re-

New York April 21.—Surgeons at the Flower hospital have just effected a remarksble cure of a patient suffering with a malignam tumor by mesas of the injection of gelatin impregnased with radium. Only one other similar case in on record, according to the hospital authorities, and was treated in Europe recently by means of radium in a glass tube, which was sewed up in the tumor.

In the Flower hospital case the tumor was as large as a grape fruit and was first reduced by use of the x-ray. Then the radio-activa gelatin was injected and at the end of five weeks the growth was so materially reduced that the patient was allowed to go home. It is expected that he will recover completely, although the tumor was in the abdomen and his death was expected six months asso. No official tuport has been made on the case nor has the name of the patient been made public. He is a resident of Westchester councy and want to the hospital with the idea of an operation. 


