Seventh Child Killed—John Byron and wife of Murray were called upon to part with another of their children yesterday afternoon, when their 7-year-old child was taken. The case was peculiarly sad because of the fact that the grim reaper had entered their abode three times since the beginning of the year. In January they suffered the loss of two little boys, and on Thursday last the little baby died after a short illness. The family have seven children in all in the fourteen years they have resided at Murray.

Sunday Prison Service—The religious services held in Judge Bowman's court room yesterday afternoon, for the prisoners by ladies of the W. C. T. U. were largely attended, there being about forty present, and the services were listened to with marked attention. Those in charge of the services feel greatly encouraged as they have labored for weeks without much success until yesterday, when they consisted of hymns in which the prisoners joined, and short talks and scriptural readings.

Marshall and N. Reynolds of the university and Professor Mable May Hawsbeck will pass on the delivery, assisted by two others.
