

## Who are Legal Voters?

Many persons appear to be exercised over the right of women to vote in this Territory; and I understand much stress was laid on the point by Mr. Cannon's opponent in his late contest for his seat in the U. S. House of Representatives, and as it will doubtless be again relied on in a contest to unseat him from the next Congress, it may be as well to examine the laws governing the claim, and review the argument based thereon.

It is urged that by Sec. 5 of the Organic Act for the Territory of Utah voting is restricted to "every free white male inhabitant above the age of twenty-one years." The law declares they shall be entitled to vote at the first election, but the qualification of voting at all subsequent elections shall be such as shall be prescribed by the Legislative Assembly.

It is contended that the power of the Legislative Assembly to act is restricted to male inhabitants. If this be so, then the legislation is not competent to qualify the words "free white," also found in said 5th section, and the word "qualifications," which the legislature was authorized to prescribe, could only operate on male inhabitants. I shall discuss the right of women to vote independent of the law of Utah, conferring on them that right or privilege.

The first proposition is, that said fifth section of the Organic Act is repealed by Article XIV of Amendments to the Constitution of the United States, which declares, "all persons born or naturalized in the United States are citizens of the United States;" and the act of Congress of May 31st, 1870, declares, "that all citizens of the United States," &c., "shall be entitled and allowed to vote at all such elections," &c.

If a woman is a person, she is a citizen, for all persons are declared citizens by the Constitution, and all citizens are declared by the act of Congress entitled to vote.

Another objection urged against women voting is that many of them are aliens, not having been naturalized. If this is true, that they are aliens and have not been naturalized, according to law, they have no right to vote, but it must not be forgotten that an alien woman "married or who shall be married to a citizen of the United States shall be deemed and taken to be a citizen." (Act of Congress, Feb. 10, 1855.)

It therefore follows, from the constitution and laws of Congress, quoted above, that, as a woman is a person, and all persons are citizens of the United States, and all citizens are entitled to vote, it does not need the aid of the statute of Utah to confer suffrage on women.

It is of course competent for the legislature to declare the qualifications of voters, as they shall be "above the age of twenty-one years," &c. Then all citizens, both men and women, who are twenty-one years of age are entitled to vote, and there is no legal restriction by the Organic Act or otherwise.

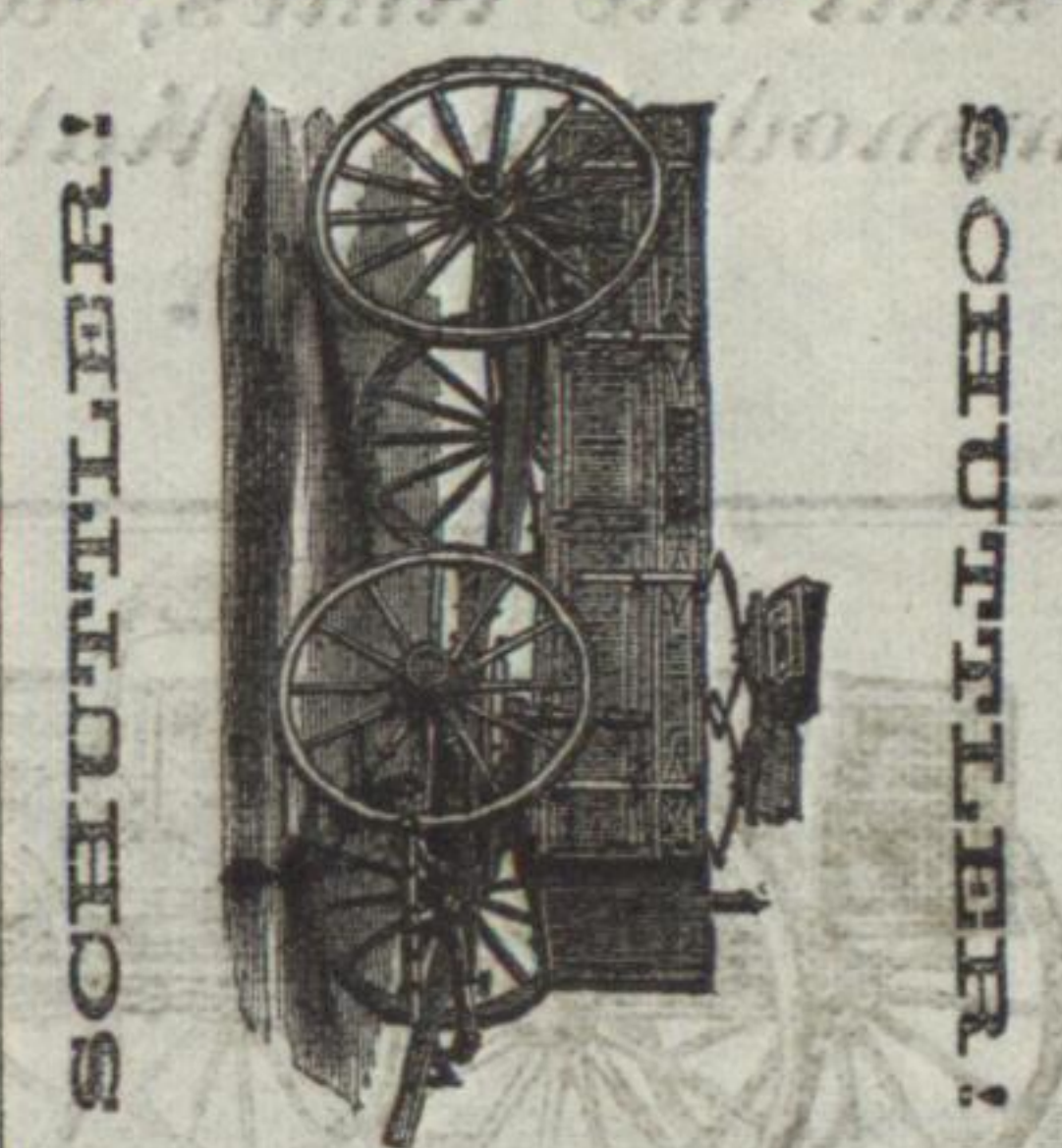
