tive Assembly."

It is contended that the power of the Legislative Assembly to act is restricted to male inhabitants. It is of course competent for the Farr A legislature to declare the qualifications of voters, as they shall be Gleason A 2 "above the age of twenty-one years," &c. Then all citizens, both men and women, who are twentyone years of age are entitled to vote, and there is no legal restriction by the Organic Act or otherwise.


