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ENGLISH GENEALOGIES.

An interesting letter on the Subject From Logan.

E. W. Atkins suggests a course of Genealogical Instruction in Utah.

LOGAN, Utah, June 7, 1903.—Yesterday I saw a letter in your issue asking for information upon genealogies. Having spent many months before leaving Utah, I am glad to see that it is important and very interesting work. I have written you a few lines in favor of teaching the subject, and it may be of interest not only to the one seeking information, but to those who are interested in the subject.
