NEW YORK. - From what can be him. gathered in well informed circles, it appears that Gen. O'Nell has sent orders to all parts of the country, ordering the Fenian soldiers in this city and the Eastern States to meet at St. Albans; those being west to move eastward toward Malone and all to assemble in the neighborhood of Vermiont and New York frontiers. It is said that the entire movement is made against the wishes of the present executive coun-

cil and legislative branch of the Fenian brotherhood and contrary to the judgement of the members of President O'Niel's Cabinet. The sealous memworked for years, gathering large sup-plies of arms and munitions, which, during the last six months, have been sent to the Canada border and are now frittered away and wasted in the present premature proceedings and are dissatiafied in consequence. A disastrous defeat is expected.

Only about a thousand men are said to be marching on Canada and there were but forty-five Fenians left this city on the eleven o'clock train on Monday evening. The officers in command of the pres-
