

## ZELAYA HANDS IN HIS RESIGNATION

Nicaraguans Were Aroused, Guns Of Revolutionists Threatened So Was No Other Course.

### CLAIMS PATRIOTIC MOTIVES.

Commissioner Appointed to Draft Bill Looking to Approval of His Last Act.

Managua, Dec. 16.—Jose Santos Zelaya has resigned from the presidency of Nicaragua. He placed his resignation in the hands of congress this morning.

Apparently there was no other course to take. The people were aroused at last. The guns of the revolutionists threatened. The warships of the United States lay in Nicaraguan ports.

Managua has been seething for days. The spirit of revolt has spread even to the gates of the palace. Zelaya surrounded himself with an armed guard. Unchecked, the populace have marched through the streets, crying for the end of the old and proclaiming the new regime.

Who will take up the reins, no one knows or cares. It is sufficient that Zelaya, as dictator, will be known no more. There is no doubt that congress will act quickly on his resignation, for the people have demanded it.

Dr. Jose Madriz, judge of the Central American court of justice at Cartago, who has been close to Zelaya, and now his choice for president, is on his way here. He will arrive on Saturday. Madriz has his following, strong and influential, even among the revolutionists, but Gen. Estrada, under whose command the great body of fighting insurgents now face Vasquez's troops at Managua, will have none of him. Estrada's word will bear weight in the choice of president.

Zelaya has known, too, that Madriz is not acceptable to the United States, and he has sought to learn who would be looked upon with favor by that government as his successor. But the American government, so far as can be learned, has named no man, and the choice probably will lie with those who have gained the upper hand.

### ZELAYA'S MESSAGE.

Accompanying his resignation Zelaya sent the following message to congress:

"The painful circumstances in which the country is plunged call for acts of abnegation and patriotism on the part of the good citizens who are the witnesses of the oppression of the republic by the heavy hand of fate. The country is staggering under a shameful revolution that has brought to the nation sovereignty, and a foreign nation unjustly intervenes in our crisis, publicly providing the rebels with arms, which has only resulted in the being defeated everywhere through the heroism of our troops.

To avoid further bloodshed, and for the reason that the revolutionists have declared that they would put down their arms when I surrendered the executive power, I hereby place in the hands of the national assembly the abandonment of the remainder of my term of office, which is to be filled by a substitute of their choosing, with the hope that will result in good to Nicaragua; the re-establishment of peace, and particularly the suspension of the hostility of the United States, to which I do not wish to give a pretext for intervention.

A commission of five deputies was appointed to draft a bill looking to the acceptance of Zelaya's resignation. News of the president's action spread throughout the city, and soon great crowds moved through the streets, shouting for the United States, Estrada and the revolution.

have been quick to break through the restraint when it was certain that the dictator could not brest the tide that had risen around him. In the latter days, Zelaya has resorted to all known tricks and contrivances to hold the people of Managua with him. Reports of a government victory at Managua have been freely circulated, and rumors that a massacre of revolutionists had occurred were allowed to spread unchallenged and undented. It finally became known that these were without a shred of truth, and they rebounded like a boomerang.

First one deputy and then another took up the denunciation of Zelaya in the chamber and later in the public places, and throughout the city demonstrations were held in which open revolt was voiced.

Last night, however, a pro-Zelaya demonstration marked the session of congress, but this had not effect outside the walls of the house. The rising was more marked today than ever, and the president decided discretion to be the better part of valor and withdrew from office.

### CAREER OF ZELAYA.

Jose Santos Zelaya has been in command in the republic of Nicaragua for 16 years. He ruled with a strong hand and has been called the stormy petrel of Central America. He was always noted for his cunning and bravery and was remarkable, too, for his ability to surround himself with those who were ready to do his bidding. As a consequence, Zelaya in later years was an absolute dictator.

He amassed wealth by taking to himself a large percentage of the profits from concessions and by forming a group of men who aided him in exacting millions from the people.

Zelaya belongs to the aristocracy of his country. He received his education in Paris, but his success was due more to the sword than to the peaceful methods of civilization. Zelaya is 51 years old, and as he is the most hated man in South or Central America, the wonder is that he managed to live so long after making so many enemies. Innumerable attempts have been made against his life, and in these emergencies his bravery has stood him in good stead.

When a comparatively young man, Zelaya began an agitation against the government, and his actions become so violent that he was expelled. He went to Guatemala, then ruled by Barrios, and there received the training that fitted him for his subsequent career. In the army of Barrios he obtained service, and, after fighting for a number of years, he reappeared in his own country at the head of a band of insurgents. He gathered strength as he went and his final battle won for him the presidency.

Zelaya's wealth is said to be enormous. He owns coffee plantations and collects on exclusive rights to many industries. The present revolt in Nicaragua began early last month and came as a climax of a series of persecutions inaugurated by Zelaya, in which the execution of the Americans, Cannon and Groce, was the most serious feature.

### NEWS GIVES SATISFACTION IN WASHINGTON

Washington, Dec. 16.—News of the resignation of President Zelaya of Nicaragua was received with evident satisfaction at the state department and elsewhere here tonight, but no comment could be elicited from any responsible official of the department. It can be said with confidence that Zelaya's resignation, welcome as it is, has by no means removed him from the attention of this government. Secretary Knox's recent letter of dismissal to Senator Rodriguez, Nicaraguan charge d'affaires, plainly indicated the intention of the United States to hold Zelaya and his circle of advisers personally responsible for the killing of Groce and Cannon, and nobody here tonight believes that Zelaya's retirement materially mitigates his personal peril as a defendant before the bar at which Mr. Knox has arraigned him, substantially on the charge of murder in the first degree.

It is well understood that this government will look with disfavor upon the installation in Zelaya's place of any of the Zelaya following. It is not too much to say that anybody that would be acceptable to Zelaya and his adherents will be viewed with suspicion by Washington.

### STATE DEPARTMENT SYMPATHETIC.

From the beginning of the present revolution in Nicaragua the sympathies of the state department officials have been with Estrada, revolutionary leader; and, while no government official would openly say such a thing, it is understood here that all hope the outcome will find Estrada in the presidency of Nicaragua.

No orders resulting from the resignation have been issued by the navy department to American vessels of war in Nicaraguan waters. It will remain for a conference between the president and Secy. Knox, probably tomorrow, to determine whether the new aspect of the situation calls for any alteration of the naval plans.

It developed tonight that the keys of the Nicaraguan legation, which have been closed since Secy. Knox's ultimatum was delivered, have been turned over, with archives and furniture of the legation, to Balbino Davalos, charge d'affaires of the Mexican embassy. This action is accepted among diplomats as proving the friendship of Mexico for Zelaya, for, they argue, such custody would not have been conferred had not the Nicaraguan government been assured of the entire good will of Mexico.

Late tonight the minister from Salvador, Senor Mejia, gave out a cablegram from President Figueroa denying a statement originating in Managua and published in several newspapers this morning that he had given his approval of the circular recently issued by President Zelaya to Central American governments, criticizing Secy. Knox and the policy of the United States in respect to Nicaragua.

### CAREER OF ESTRADA.

Gen. Juan J. Estrada, central figure in the Washington forecast of the new era in Nicaragua, has had a stormy and busy career. He is 38 years old, and has taken part in nearly every war in which his country has engaged since he was old enough to bear arms. He was a colonel in the war of 1896, and two years later was appointed governor of the province of Coto de Garce at D. In the war of 1899 he was seriously wounded and was forced to visit New York for surgical treatment. Follow-

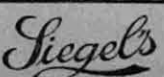
