ZELAYA HANDS IN

HIS RESIGNATION

Nicaraguans Were Aroused, Guns

Of Revolutionists Threatened

So Was No Other Course.

CLAIMS PATRIOTIC MOTIVES.

Managua, Dec. 16 .- Jose Santos Ze laya has resigned from the presidency of Nicaragua. He placed his resignation in the hands of congress this morn-

Apparently there was no other cours to take. The people were aroused at last. The guns of the revolutionists threatened. The warships of the United states lay in Nicaragua ports.

Managua has been seething for days The spirit of revolt has spread even to the gates of the palace. Zelaya sur-rounded himself with an armed guard. Unchecked, the populace have marched through the streets, crying for the end of the old and proclaiming the new regime.

Through the scheets, crying for new regime. Who will take up the reins, no one knows or cares. It is sufficient that Zelaya, as dictator, will be known no more. There is no doubt that congress will act quickly on his resignation, for the people have demasnded it. Dr. Jose Madriz, judge of the Central American court of justice at Carta-go, who has been close to Zelaya, and is now his choice for president, is on his way here. He will arrive on Saturday. Madriz has his following, strong and fufficiential, even among the revolution-ists, but Gen. Estrada, under whose command the great body of fighting in-surgents now face Vasquez's troops at Rama, will have none of him. Estra-da's word will bear weight in the choice of president.

da's word will bear weight in the choice of president. Zelaya has known, too, that Madriz is not acceptable to the United States. and he has sought to learn who would be looked upon with favor by that government as his successor. But the American government, so far as can be lacrned, has named no man, and the choice probably will lie with those who have gained the upper hand.

ZELAYA'S MESSAGE.

Accompanying his resignation Zelaya ent the following message to con-

Accompanying ins respiration leads a "The painful circumstances in which the country is plunged call for acts of abnegation and patriotism on the part of the good citizens, who are the wit-nesses of the oppression of the republic by the heavy hand of fate. The coun-try is staggering under a shameless revolution that threatens the nation's sovereignty, and a foreign nation un-justify intervenes in our crisis, publicly providing the rebels with arms, which has only resulted in their being defeat-ed everywhere through the heroism of our troops. "To avoid further bloodshed, and for the reason that the revolutionsis have

"To avoid further bloodshed, and for the reason that the revolutionists have declared that they would put down their arms when I surrendered the ex-ecutive power. I hereby place in the hands of the national assembly the abandonment of the remainder of my term of office, which is to be filled by a substitute of their choosing, with the hope that his will result in good to Nicaragua; the re-establishment of peace, and particularly the suspension of the hostility of the United States, to which I do no wish to give a pretext for intervention." NEWS GIVES SATISFACTION IN WASHINGTON

Washington, Dec. 16.-News of the resignation of President Zelaya of Nicaragu was received with evident satisfaction at the state department and elsewhere here tonight, but no com-ment could be elicited from any re-sponsible office of the administration. It can be said with confidence that Zelaya's resignation, welcome as it is, has by no means removed him from the attention of this government. Secy Knox's recent letter of dismissal to Senator Rodriguez, Nicaraguan charge d'affaires, plainly indicated the inten-tion of the United States to hold Zelaya and his circle of advisers personally re-sponsible for the killing of Groce and Cannon, and nobody here tonight be-lieves that Zelaya's refirement materi-ally mitigates his personal peril as a defendant before the bar at which Mr. Knox has arraigned him, substantially on the charge of murder in the first de-gree. STATE DEPARTMENT SYMPA-THIES.

THEES. From the beginning of the present reviution in Nicaragua the sympathies of the state department officials have been with Estrada, revolutionary lead-er; and, while no government official would openly say such a thing, it is understood here that all hope the out-come will find Estrada in the presidency of Nicaragua. No orders resulting from the resigna-tion have been issued by the navy de-partment to American vessels of war in Nicaraguan waters. It will remain for a conference be-tween the president and Secy. Knox, probably tomorrow, to determine whether the new aspect of the situation calls for any alteration of the naval plans. To decelored tonight that the keys

calls for any alteration of the havai plans. It developed tonight that the keys of the Nicaraguan legation, which has been closed since Secy. Knox's ulti-matum was delivered, have been turned over, with archives and furniture of the legation, to Bablino Davalos, charge d'affaires of the Mexican embassy. This action is accepted among diplo-mats as proving the friendship of Mexico for Zelaya, for, they argue, such custody would not have been conferred had not the Nicaraguan government been assured of the entire good will of Mexico.

He was a colonel in the war of 1596, and wo years later was appointed governor of the province of Cap Gracio al Dio.
