MORE TROOPS FOR MANILA

Five Regiments Directed to Sail at Once From San Francisco
For the Philippine Islands.

Order Causes Excitement—Means of Transportation—Government
Says There Is No Exigency, Only a Filling Up of the
Philippine Garrison as Originally Intended.

Washington, Sept. 18.—Five regiments now at San Francisco have been ordered to Manila. Arrangements for their transportation will be made when the regiments ordered to Manila are the following:

First Regt., 10th, Twentieth Kansas,
Fifteenth Missouri, First Michigan, and
a detachment of the Second Oregon.

San Francisco, Sept. 19.—The news received from Washington adds to the effect that no regiments were expected to sail this day, but that arrangements to handle the men of all regiments will be made when ordered to Manila. Orders go to the adjutant general of the army, the price of the government were once more raised to the normal rate, never having except over this city or in three months ago when a detachment of troops were of all usual military accoutrements. The regular militia had already been given out that no more soldiers would go to the Philippines and the work of dismantling the regiments in even a partial way will be continued until such time as recruits are received.

The Associated Press bulletin mentioned the decision of the department at Washington that arrangements for the reorganization of the troops were in progress. A call on the Manila Exchange resulted in the information that the only unit available for transportation purposes, not already elsewhere engaged, is the senior Contingent, and she also has been spared by the government on the
