

ITALY INUNDATED.

TERRIBLE SUFFERINGS OF THE PEOPLE—PRIVATION AND PESTILENCE.

A correspondent of the London Daily News in Italy gives a fearful account of the suffering caused by the late inundations of the Po. Near Rome a huge gap had been formed in the embankment of the river, and the waters were rushing through like a cataract, doing great damage. An attempt had been made to fill up this gap, and 75 metres out of a total of 100,000 had been completed, when the head engineer ordered the workmen to abandon the undertaking. The Po had been gradually rising, and ten minutes after the water left the river bed the water rushed over its progress, and in an hour not a trace of that barrier could be seen. At Scandiano the people seemed overwhelmed by despair. Fugitives from the inundated districts were crowded into the houses, and typhus and small-pox were making fearful ravages. Just outside one of the churches the dead had been buried, the cemetery being under water. In a temporary hospital, the regular hospital being flooded, there were forty patients suffering from virulent small-pox and typhus, with but six mattresses, ten pillows, and a few scant coverlets among them. The correspondent thinks that if all this suffering and wretchedness could be brought home to the people of Italy and England, there would not be by the thousand of the year "a single individual untroubled or untried by the Panacea and the Secchia."
