CAPTURE 3,000 SPANILARDS

Desperate Condition of the Spanish Forces at Manila—Have Been 36 Hours Without Food.

Spanish Commander Wanted to Surrender to Americans to Avoid a Massacre, but the Archbishop Overruled Him—Spanish Boats Sent Out for Food Fail to Effect a Landing.

Manila, June 12.—A report from the Spanish forces at Manila, dated June 11, states that the Spanish forces are in a desperate condition. They have been 36 hours without food and are suffering from lack of ammunition. The Spanish commander, General Yriarte, has offered to surrender to the Americans to avoid a massacre, but the Archbishop has overruled him. Spanish boats sent out for food have failed to effect a landing.
